- · Use of RTI (Response to Intervention) Framework
 - Embedded across literacy, numeracy, SEL, and career development to provide tiered supports for all learners.
- Implementation of AVID Strategies
 - AVID's WICOR strategies (Writing, Inquiry, Collaboration, Organization, Reading) are foundational Tier 1 supports.
- · Focus on Inclusive, Differentiated Instruction
 - Co-developed assessments and instructional strategies tailored to diverse learner needs (ELL, ISP, Indigenous, designated learners).

 - Consistent targeting of supports for Indigenous students, students with learning designations, and Children and Youth in Care (CYIC). We also closely monitor students who are ELL, ISP and those transitioning to high school.

ADDITIONAL INFO:

ACSS enrolls 900 students from grades 9 - 12. As a community school, we also partner with Betty Gilbert Middle School (BGMS) to teach Grade 8 Exploration courses (Expos) to 169 students. Therefore, our grade 8–12 total student population is 1069 students. ACSS is a very diverse learning community. Some of the unique distinctions in our population of 900 include: 192 learning designations (21%), 101 self-identify as Indigenous (11%), 164 students are part of our International Student Program (ISP) (18%) and 84 are ELL learners (9%).
