Weather and Appropriate Clothing:

As the cold and wet days settle in, we kindly remind families to ensure children are dressed appropriately for outdoor play. Students will continue to go outside for fresh air and exercise—even on rainy days—so proper attire is essential. Please send your child in boots and a waterproof jacket with a hood on rainy mornings.





To help keep everyone comfortable, we ask that all students carry an extra change of clothes (shirt, pants, and socks) in their backpacks in case they get wet during recess or lunch play. We also encourage you to label your child's outerwear (jackets, sweaters, coats) with their first nad last name to help us return lost items—our Lost & Found is always overflowing!

Grade 1 Classroom Support Update

We're pleased to share that Mrs. Roberts will be supporting our Grade 1 classrooms this year through a co-teaching model. As a familiar and valued member of our school community, Mrs. Roberts will be working alongside the Grade 1 teachers to provide additional support to students during class time.



Student in Distress and School Safety



Health and safety are a priority in the Langley School District. Our schools follow emergency procedures to help keep students, staff, and the community safe. Depending on the situation, communication to parents/caregivers is needed to keep families informed about incidents in our school, such as

during lockdowns, hold & secures, and room clears. Sometimes these incidents may not be emergencies but are medical crises. It is important to note that the decision to send communications to families is dependent on a variety of factors including the nature of what happened, who has witnessed or was directly impacted by what happened, as well as student and staff privacy. Although communication is unique and dependent on the specific situation, there are times when a student is in distress and the incident may require a message or letter to families. In addition to communication to parents/caregivers, teachers and staff may debrief with students after an incident that may have upset them. In some cases, the school counsellor may offer support to students in need. As always, we want families to let us know if your child requires support. If you have any questions or concerns about communication related to emergencies or incidents, please reach out to the school.



Community Volunteers in Emergencies

Emergencies can happen unexpectedly due to weather events (e.g. earthquake or flooding) or unforeseen situations in the community. The health and safety of students, staff, and families is the District's priority. The District together with schools follow emergency procedures to respond to incidents as well as prevent them from happening. As stated in the provincial <u>Emergency Management Planning Guide for Schools, Districts and Authorities</u>, staff have a legal "duty of care," meaning that they "must ensure that students are cared for until such time as they can be safely reunited with their parents." Depending on the situation, the school may be caring for students for many days.

In these circumstances, schools may rely on members of the community to assist with emergency responses. Administrators may send a request to parents/guardians to help volunteer with first aid, facilities and maintenance, safety and security, and general labour. Adults with special skills in health care, policing, and engineering would be an asset in an emergency. No action is needed from families at this time as the purpose is to keep families informed.

HEARING LOSS

may go undetected until the school years

Teachers are important partners in helping to detect hearing loss



Children may have unknown hearing loss when they start school. Children with hearing loss are often very adaptable and have learned strategies to help compensate. Hearing loss can be hard to detect and does not have to be severe in order to impact a student's learning. A slight hearing loss or hearing loss in just one ear can impact a child's learning and development.

Children born in Canada receive a hearing screening at birth through the infant screening program.

This screening catches hearing loss present at birth, but there are different forms of hearing loss that develop later in childhood (delayed onset hearing loss and progressive hearing loss).


Dear Families,
