Learning is not one-size-fits-all. It is our responsibility to nurture the gifts and strengths of each individual, so they may grow into confident contributors to their community.






Emergency Preparedness and Student Pick-up

As part of our emergency preparedness program at Uplands Elementary, a plan has been put in place in the event of a school wide evacuation that requires student pick-up. This plan follows protocols that will be implemented throughout all Langley schools. If students are required to be picked up from school after an emergency caused from an earthquake, fire or other incident, parents are asked to follow the following protocols as a means to ensure that all students are accounted for at the school level.

In case of an emergency pick-up:

- You will go around the **South side of the school (44A Ave)** where there will be **Greeters** to meet you, they will direct you to the **check-in station**. Bring your ID to the Check-In station,
- After you have checked in, runners will retrieve your child(ren) from the Safe Assembly Area and bring them to the Student Reunification Checkout where staff will ensure your child is being picked up by individuals who have been approved by the child's parents/guardians via the Student Reunification form.
- □ Upon being reunited with your child(ren), exit to the Southwest side of the school.



Please note:

Only the legal parent, and identified emergency contacts, will be allowed to pick up your child(ren). Please bring ID.
If you need to update or add a person to the Student Reunification Form that was completed at the beginning of the year, please contact our admin assistant Deanne Halldorson

**We recognize that in an emergency situation stress levels will be high. However, patience and communication between parents and the school is crucial to ensure everyone's safety. **

School Status Info During Inclement Weather

Information about school status during **inclement weather**, **snow closures and power outages are an annual occurrence in Langley School District**. So, where do you go to get information about the status of schools during periods of inclement weather?

If you are able to access the internet via computer or smartphone, current information about Langley schools can be accessed on:

- On the District and School websites
 (See alert announcing the effected schools displayed at the top of the district website)
- On Facebook, X (formerly twitter) and Instagram
- On media outlets such as CKNW 980AM, News1130, 170.1FM Country, CBC Radio 690AM, Pulse Radio 107.7 or 88.1FM

If you don't have internet connectivity but your phone is working, call a relative or friend in an area that has not been affected by the storm and ask them to check the district website for you.

Please note that Langley District schools are all considered 'open' until a decision to close is required. Decisions on school closures are usually made by 6:30 am. As always, it is a parent's decision whether to send their child to school based on safety and individual circumstances. If you feel it is unsafe for you or your child to travel to or attend an open school for any reason, please keep your child home and report an absence to the school.

In the event of inclement weather, please do not call the school. During a power outage we are reduced to one landline. We need to this line free for emergencies. Also, the office is not able to answer so many phone calls.

Keep your children free from respiratory illnesses this winter

As the weather gets colder and we spend more time indoors, we're more likely to get sick with things like colds, flu or COVID-19 because these illnesses spread more easily in enclosed spaces.

Everyone should take these steps to protect themselves and limit the spread of respiratory illnesses:

- Get vaccinated for flu and COVID-19 if you are eligible.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water. Use alcohol-based sanitizer if soap and water is not available.
- Avoid touching your face, especially your eyes, mouth and nose.
- Cough and sneeze into your elbow.
- If you have flu-like symptoms, stay home and away from people at higher risk of serious illness. If you are sick and cannot stay away from others, wear a mask. Learn more about masks here.

Vaccinations for respiratory illness

Vaccinations prepare our immune system to recognize and respond to viruses. When children get immunized, they are less likely to get sick or pass along illness to others and better able to focus on learning, playing and doing the activities they love.

Register your children with the Get Vaccinated system so you can be reminded to get flu or COVID-19 vaccinations when they are due. Seasonal respiratory vaccinations are available from pharmacies, public health units and some primary care providers.

School-aged immunizations

As children get older, the protection from some <u>infant immunizations</u> can wear off. To set young people up for long-term health and well-being, vaccines are offered routinely in kindergarten, grade 6 and grade 9 with catch-up opportunities in other grades. Getting your child vaccinated on schedule is one of the best ways to protect their health. All routine school-aged immunizations are free in British Columbia. If your child is not up-to-date with their vaccines, please make an appointment with a public health unit, family doctor, nurse practitioner or pharmacy. If your child's record shows their vaccines are not current, but they did get vaccines from a health care provider outside of public health:

- Contact the health care provider who immunized your child and ask for a copy of the immunization record.
- Report these immunizations to Public Health online at: http://www.fraserhealth.ca/immunizationform
