KINDERGARTEN Kindergarten families will attend their family interviews and then Kindergarten students will follow their gradual entry schedule until full days start on Monday, September 21st.

TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 8th This is the first day of school for students in **Grades 1-5**. Students attend only from **8:43am – 10:15am**, please plan your childcare accordingly.

NEW STUDENTS Meet in the gym at 8:43am on September 8th. They will be greeted and assigned to classes with similar age peers. A staff member will walk with them to their new classroom.

RETURNING STUDENTS Go to their former classroom to meet their teacher from last year. They will stay in this transitional grouping for the week.

Students continue to meet with their former teacher and classmates. As soon as our registrations are in place, we will move students into their new classes. On the day this happens, all families will receive a 'Welcome Letter' e-mail from their new teacher. This email will explain which classroom door to meet your child at and will include our school map.

We understand that this week can be confusing. We will have additional staff outside able to answer questions, show you maps, and ensure you and your child find each other. We do this every year successfully, so please do not worry.

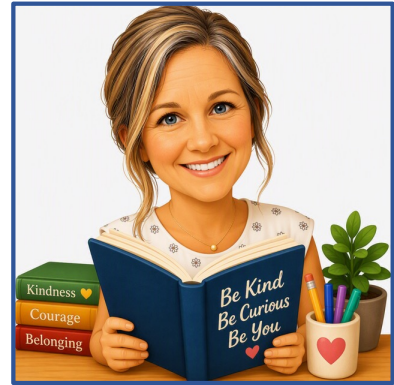

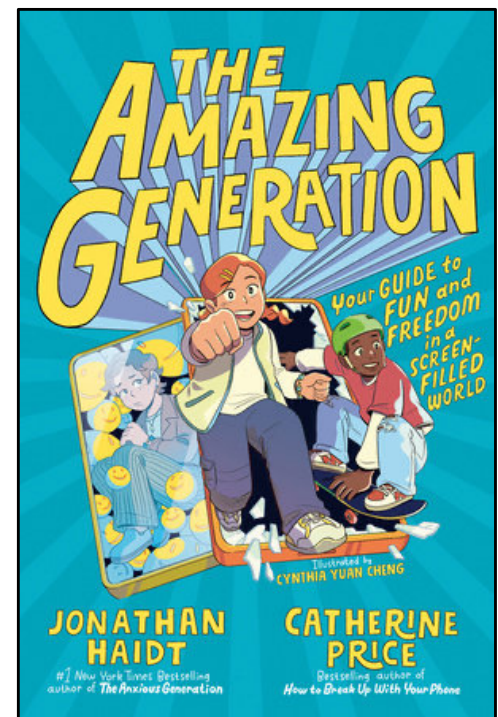

Parent Consent Forms on MyEdBC

Each year, Langley Schools asks families to complete a set of parent consent forms for their child. These consent forms are required by our schools to ensure the health, safety, and security of all students. Beginning in this school year, Langley Schools will be using the MyEdBC parent portal to collect this information. During the second week of school, please watch for an email from the MyEdBC system notifying families to log in to the MyEdBC parent portal to complete the online consent forms.

A set of consent forms will need to be completed for each child attending a Langley school. It is advised to access MyEdBC and complete the parent consent forms using a desktop or laptop as the process requires the full site version (which is not mobile-friendly). 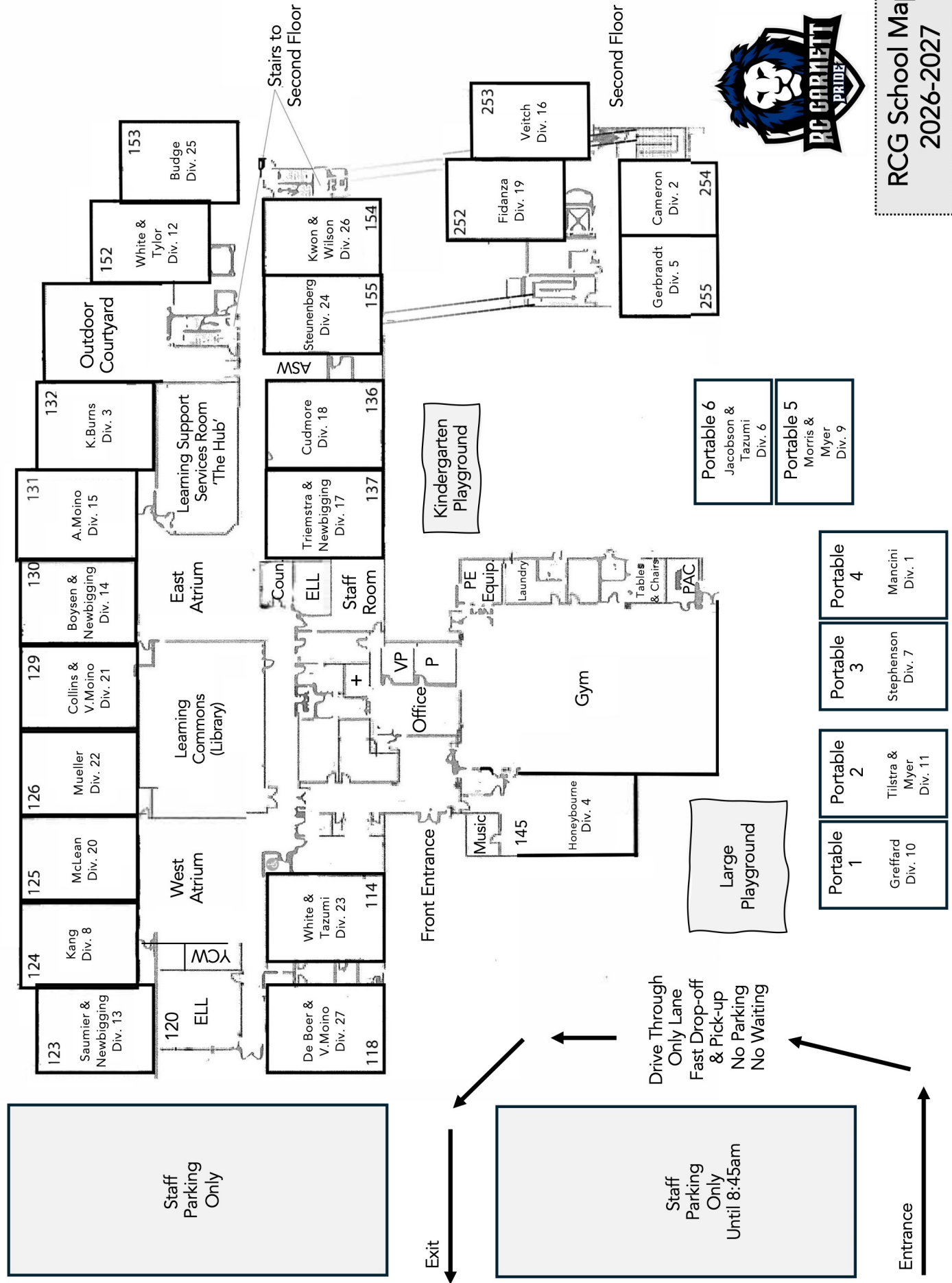

School Start

Back to School with School Start

RCG is excited to offer the opportunity to purchase quality standardized school supplies through School Start for the 2026/2027 school year. This process will save you both time and money.

Please note that this is for Grades 1 – 5 only. Kindergarten Supplies are purchased in bulk and parents will pay the school in September.

These kits come with everything you need. You have the “Starter Package” (these are must haves) and you have the “Required Items”. The “Required Items” are items that you may already have at home, so there is no need to purchase (pencil crayons, crayons etc). If you do not have these items, you can purchase what is needed.

You have three options for ordering:
