January has been a busy start to the year, here are some activities that have taken place:

<u>Welcome Back Assembly</u> – We had our Welcome Back Assembly for students the second day back from the break. In that Assembly, we reviewed our fundamental pillars, general expectations, and finished off reading a beautiful story book titled "You, Me, We – A Celebration of Peace and Community".

<u>Author Visit</u> – Some of the classes participated in an author visit with Rebecca Selven Tamil. Her story is titled "Mellie Goes to the Circus". The purpose of the story is to encourage students to get active and healthy, with a strong focus on physical literacy. Teachers were provided with a follow up lesson plan with the story. Rebecca was very inspiring about her journey to becoming an author, and staff and students really enjoyed her visit!

<u>Great Big Buddy Read Event</u> – Yesterday, students participated in the Great Big Buddy Read Event. This is a province-wide event organized to promote the importance of reading together and to highlight that reading and literacy skills are not acquired in isolation. <u>Middle Years Development Instrument (MDI)</u> – The Gr. 5/6 students participated in the MDI survey last Friday. This survey is an opportunity to gain a deeper understanding of children's social and emotional health, wellbeing and assets during middle childhood, from their own perspective. It is completely confidential, and the data will be shared with schools to inform our teaching and learning practices for our students.

Action Plan for Learning Goals

<u>Literacy Goal</u> – Aligning with our Action Plan for Learning Goals, our primary staff have been exploring different approaches to supporting literacy interventions for our students. While all primary classes are providing targeted literacy interventions in their classrooms; one example we're currently exploring in Term 2, are Div. 7 & 8 classes piloting a platooning model to target specific literacy skills for our students, up until spring break. Our non-enrolling teachers are taking part in this project, which includes our LA/LLI Teacher and our Resource Team. Our intermediate staff are also looking at different ways to support with targeting specific literacy skills, and we have been using our PLC Time on Wednesdays to discuss instructional strategies and assessments with ongoing guidance and support from one of the members of our District Literacy Team.

<u>February Design & Assessment Day</u> – To further support our APFL goal around Literacy, we are pleased to have Dr. Nancy Young join us on Feb. 24 to present her book titled "Climbing the Ladder of Reading and Writing". Dr. Young will be focusing on ways to address a wide range of literacy learning needs, leveraging the Science of Reading and how we can improve outcomes for all of our students. We're looking forward to this amazing Pro-D Opportunity as a staff!

<u>Nut Aware School</u> – A friendly reminder that Coghlan Fundamental is a nut aware school. - 3. Stream of Dreams instructors present the workshops, usually over 1 to 4 days, depending on how many students participate in the program.
- 4. After the workshops are completed, Stream of Dreams staff design the mural with the help of community volunteers, ideally 6-8 people.
