SEISMIC UPGRADES

As you drive past our school, you will notice that part of our school is under construction for seismic upgrades. There will be minimal impact on the students during this construction. During the construction process, some of our space will be reconfigured to accommodate more classroom and learning space within the building. While the construction process is taking place, some students will be in portables while their classroom space is being upgraded. There are a variety of phases and therefore once the classroom space is completed, students will move back into the building into their new space and the next group will move out to the portables. We will share the most up to date information as we move from one phase to the next phase of the construction project.

CLASS PLACEMENTS

Parents will be emailed in the afternoon on Tuesday, September 3rd indicating their child's tentative division and where to meet their teacher outside on Wednesday, September 4th. We will also have class lists posted outside of our main entrance on Wednesday morning. In addition, staff wearing hi-vis vests will be outside Wednesday morning to assist students in finding their line up/meeting spot and their class. Please know that as the School District reconfigures their numbers over the month of September, this may not be the continued placement for this school year. We appreciate your patience as we go through this process.

PLEASE NOTE: There have been some changes to Grade 7 classroom placements for the 2024-2025 school year. This is due to staffing changes and increased enrollment.

ILLNESS/ABSENCE

Please keep sick children home from school. This way they do not infect other children. However, sometimes children are recovering and no longer contagious. If this is the case, we ask that you please contact your child's teacher.

Peter Ewart has an automated system where we contact the home of every student who is absent to inform parents of their child's absence. You can help our wonderful secretaries by emailing the school at pemattendance@sd35.bc.ca and letting us know your son or daughter will be absent or late. If this is not an option we ask that you phone the school at 778-726-4815. This



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not only saves us from making an unnecessary call, but if there are students out there who need our help, it helps us identify them faster.

DROP OFF/PICK UP

Please review some important reminders below related to pick-up and drop-off in the North parking lot of the school:

- The lane at the front of the school will remain closed at pick-up/drop off times as construction for seismic upgrades continues.
- Pick-up and drop-off should only take place in the pick-up/drop-off lane in the North parking lot
- There is no stopping to pick-up or drop-off in the through lane or throughout the parking lot
 - Children cutting past cars pulling in and out of the pick-up/drop-off lane is extremely dangerous
 - Even if your child is right there and ready
- Staff should be treated with respect
 - They are there to keep all children safe
 - If you have a concern with a staff member, please contact administration
- Cones should not be driven over or moved
 - You may not understand why they have been placed where they are, but rest assured, in a school with more than 900 students, there are a variety of factors for us to consider
- Please drive under 10 km/hour on school property
 - We want all of our students to make it home safely
- Pull ahead as far forward as you can in the drop-off lane
 - The cars in line behind you are waiting to pick up their children too

Most of Peter Ewart Middle School's catchment is within walking distance. We are fortunate in this community to have the vast majority of our students within walking distance to and from



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school. Furthermore, we have parking to the north of our grounds. If you're finding it particularly frustrating to drive onto our school property and your child is unable to walk from home, consider dropping them off nearby and having them walk one of the many pathways to our school. MORNING LINE UPS

Teachers will meet their students at their designated doors/meeting spots. The spots will be marked with a sign that has the teacher's name and room number on it. Doors will also be marked. Further instructions will be included in the email sent out by the classroom teachers on September 3rd.

LATE ARRIVALS/EARLY PICK UPS

Late arrivals need to enter through the front entrance and sign-in at the office. If you are picking your child up early, you must call the office and sign them out.

LOCKERS

We intend to use lockers this year. With the construction that is happening at Peter Ewart, some classes may need to wait until the construction is completed in their assigned area of the school before they are assigned a locker. Lockers are assigned by the classroom teacher. Please note that most lockers are 'half' lockers, so those big suitcase style rolling backpacks will NOT fit in them. We request that locks are to be purchased through the school as we have the ability to open them if a child forgets the combination.

VISITORS TO THE BUILDING

Any visitors to the building should phone ahead and make an appointment through the office to enter the building. Visitors enter the building through the main entrance. Visitors must sign in before entering the office. A drop off table is located outside the office for items dropped off by parents/guardians.
