Colour Your Summer

o If you child took part in the BC Summer Reading Club, please have your child bring the reading log to the library. We are displaying the reading logs on the bulletin board outside the library for the month of September. Students will also get to choose a prize for participating. If your family did not participate this past summer, think about joining next summer.

The 20 Minute Reading Challenge

O Home reading starts on October 1st. All students will be bringing home an October home reading sheet. The goal is to read at least 20 minutes a day, and at least 20 days each month. Please have your children colour in a pumpkin on each day that they read 20 minutes. The instructions are also on the October sheet. The sheets will need to be returned the first week of November.

Langley Book Of The Year

• We will officially start this district wide reading program on October 1st. This program is geared for students in grades 4 - 7, but grade 3 students are welcome to read the books as well. 12 novels have been selected by Langley Teacher Librarians and students are eligible to vote for their favourite book in May if they have read at least 3 of the 12 books. At LFES we have a pizza celebration lunch if students qualify: Grade 5's read 8 books, Grade 4's read 7 books, and Grade 3's read 5 books. The book covers are posted on both the bulletin board on the outside wall of the library and inside the library. After reading a book students must see library staff for credit for reading the book. Students will be asked a few questions about the plot of the book, and then they will be given a sticker to put up on the book cover on the bulletin board in the hall. The books are available through our library, the Fraser Valley Regional Libraries, and through the Sora App. Students may also listen to the books through audio apps. Fraser Health Immunization Information

The info below is from Fraser Health

All routine school-aged immunizations are free in British Columbia. It is important that all students stay up to date with their immunizations. For Kindergarten - Grade 5:

Check your child's immunization record: Log in to Health Gateway at <u>HealthGateway.gov.bc.ca</u> to see what's on file.

Get immunized: If your child is missing any vaccine, book an appointment with public health or check with your local pharmacist, family doctor, or nurse practitioner.

Report your immunizations:

If vaccines your child has received aren't on their public health record, get a copy from your provider and upload it at <u>fraserhealth.ca/immunizationform</u>.

Records can be submitted in any language. Learn more at <u>fraserhealth.ca/immunize</u>.
