
Black History Month

WIN (What I Need) Time: Supporting Every Student

At Langley Fundamental Elementary, we are excited to introduce **WIN (What I Need) Time**, a school-wide initiative designed to strengthen **core skills for all students**. WIN Time is a universal model intended to benefit every learner, not just a select group, by ensuring all students receive targeted support from classroom teachers, ELL staff, Resource staff, and administrators working together.

This year, we will be using WIN Time to focus specifically on **writing**, as this has been our school's primary learning goal. Writing is an essential tool for communication, creativity, and learning, and we want every child to feel confident and successful as they grow as writers.

Each week, grade-group teams will receive 30 minutes of dedicated WIN Time to provide purposeful, targeted writing instruction. As we learn and grow with this model, it may evolve, but our commitment remains the same: to enrich students' learning experiences and help them thrive as writers

Info from the Ministry of Education

Student Learning Survey 2025/2026

The Provincial Student Learning Survey is unique in its scope, size and usefulness to schools. It gathers information from parents/guardians/caregivers, teachers, and students on topics related to school environment, safety, and achievement. The information is used for planning in individual schools and provides a district and provincial perspective.

Early in **2026** the Student Learning Survey will be administered to students in grade 4, their parents/guardians/caregivers, and all school staff. We encourage parents/guardians/caregivers to participate in this survey, as the results are important in identifying and celebrating current strengths, as well as determining where the school needs to focus improvement. The surveys contain standard questions for the Province – in addition, questions from the school and/or district that focus on local conditions or issues may be included.

The survey can be completed electronically and can be accessed on the Internet at <https://www2.gov.bc.ca/gov/content/education-training/k-12/support/student-learning-survey>. Any computer or mobile device with an Internet connection can be used, and access to the e-survey is simple and secure. The survey can be accessed through the link and by clicking on Take the Survey. On the login page, click on the Parents icon, and then select the school district and school name where your child attends school. Provincial, District and School Reports for previous years can be viewed at the same site under the *Results* section.

The e-survey site will be open until May 1, 2026.

Many families do not have private dental insurance, but they may be eligible to apply for the following programs.


