
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AROUND OUR SCHOOL

Snow closures and power outages are an annual occurrence in Langley School District. So, where do you go to get information about the status of schools during periods of inclement weather? If you are able to access the internet via computer or smartphone, current information about Langley schools can be accessed on all school websites or www.sd35.bc.ca. Updates are also posted to Twitter @LangleySchools and Facebook at www.facebook.com/langleyschooldistrict. If you don't have internet connectivity but your phone is working, call a relative or friend in an area that has not been affected by the storm and ask them to check the district website for you. Local radio stations are also informed of school status in Langley. Tune in to CKWX 1130AM, CKNW 980AM, Country Radio 107.1FM, Pulse 107.7 or CBC 690AM or 88.1FM for updates.

Please note that Langley District schools are all considered 'open' until a decision to close is required. Decisions on school closures are usually made by 6:30am. As always, it is a parent's decision whether to send their child to school based on safety and individual circumstances. If you feel it is unsafe for you or your child to travel to or attend an open school for any reason, please keep your child home and report an absence to the school.

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GRAD UPDATE

Dear Grade 12 Students and Families:

We know that you have anxiously been awaiting communication with respect to Grad 2021 celebrations and we thank you for your patience with us as we have gathered information to determine District direction as it relates to Graduation activities this year.

As you are aware, the COVID-19 situation provincially and regionally has not improved. We are continuing to see a high number of cases in the community and restrictions in place impacting our daily lives. Unfortunately, large scale in-person grad ceremonies, banquets and prom celebrations cannot go ahead this year due to the provincial ban on gatherings. In fact, most of the venues that we have used in the past for gatherings have cancelled their bookings for this year. The disappointment students and families are feeling is shared by the staff and administration at Aldergrove Community Secondary School. We care about our grads and want to honour them in way that is healthy, safe, and meaningful.

Last year, we tried to be as creative as we could be within the guidelines presented and learned many things that will help us plan this year. As it currently stands, given the current health restrictions, we are not able to replicate the formats that we used last year. We know that the current restrictions are in place until after the May Long Weekend. As such, as a District, we have decided to delay making a final decision on the format of our graduation celebrations until we know what restrictions will be in place after the May Long Weekend. Our hope is that there will be fewer restrictions and the resulting options available to us will allow for more family involvement in our graduation ceremonies.

*For now, we know that families need to make plans and schedules. **All secondary schools in Langley will be hosting their graduation ceremonies during the week of June 21st.** After the May Long Weekend, we will be able to finalize decisions about our graduation ceremony formats and communicate that information out to students and families shortly thereafter.*

We recognize that this information leaves uncertainty for our families and our grads. However, we want to allow more time for the COVID-19 landscape to settle. In the meantime, we will continue to work with our grad classes and school communities to find innovative ways to celebrate graduation this year within the criteria set by the Public Health Officer. Please remember, the commitment from administrators and staff must be reasonable and within our capacity. We appreciate your ongoing support during this difficult time.

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Mask Guidelines Update—March 31st 2021



March 31, 2021

Dear Parents/Guardians, Students and Staff:

Re: Mask Guidelines Update

In follow up to yesterday's Information Bulletin, the District is sharing an update on guidelines regarding mask wearing in schools. The Ministry of Education, Provincial Health Office, and BC Centre for Disease Control have provided school districts with amendments to the K-12 health and safety guidelines which are found in these two documents:

BCCDC Public Health Guidance for K-12 Schools

Provincial COVID-19 Health and Safety Guidelines for K-12 Settings

Here's What You Need To Know

Effective immediately all K-12 staff, students in Grades 4 to 12, and visitors to schools will be required to wear non-medical masks in all indoor areas, including when they are at their workstations (desks), and on school buses - both within and outside of their learning group.

Exceptions include:

- A person who is unable to wear a mask because they do not tolerate it (for health or behavioural reasons)
- A person unable to put on or remove a mask without the assistance of another person
- If the mask is removed temporarily for the purposes of identifying the person wearing it
- If the mask is removed temporarily to engage in an educational activity that cannot be performed while wearing a mask (e.g. actively playing a wind instrument, high-intensity physical activity, etc.)
- If a person is eating or drinking
- If a person is behind a barrier
- While providing a service to a person with a disability or diverse ability (including but not limited to a hearing impairment), where visual cues, facial expressions and/or lip reading/movements are important

Students in Kindergarten to Grade 3 are strongly encouraged to wear a mask indoors in schools and on school buses – both within and outside of their learning group – though mask wearing ultimately remains a personal or family/caregiver choice for these students, and their choices must be respected.

Students will be able to remove their masks while outside, including at recess, lunchtime and while learning outside. As weather improves, teachers will continue to look for opportunities to move their classes outside.

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Enhanced Safety Measures for K-12 Schools

The District appreciates all the hard work from students, staff, and families in helping keep our community safe. We continue to work closely with the Ministry of Education and Provincial Health Office. This week the province announced changes to COVID-19 health and safety guidelines for schools. Mask requirements for middle and secondary school students and K-12 staff have been amended. Guidelines have also been strengthened for physical education and music classes.

It is important to note, our schools will need some time to implement these new changes; all changes will be in effect as of February 26, 2021. Your continued patience and support are appreciated. If you have any questions, please contact the school.

Changes to Mask Wearing

All middle and secondary students and K-12 staff will now be required to wear non-medical masks in all indoor areas, including when they are with their learning groups. The only exceptions are when:

- *sitting or standing at their seat or workstation in a classroom;*
- *there is a barrier in place; or*
- *they are eating or drinking.*

For elementary students, wearing masks indoors remain a personal choice.

It is important to note, as advised by the province, these changes above do not apply to grade 6 and 7 students attending an elementary school.

Changes to Physical Education and Music Classes

High-intensity physical activities are to be held outside as much as possible. Shared equipment or items, such as weight machines, treadmills or musical instruments, can be used only if they are cleaned between use, according to strict school sanitization guidelines. Students using equipment or playing instruments should also be spaced at least two metres apart and masks are to be used when singing.

COVID-19 and Youth Mental Health

Since COVID-19 was declared a pandemic, many public health responses have been implemented including social distancing measures and school closures.

These measures may have an impact on the mental health of children and teens, and we need to adjust the type and amount of resources being offered our children.

The MyHEARTSMAP team needs your help to measure how much and in what ways the changes in our lives during the pandemic have affected the social and psychological wellness of our children and youth.

Using the MyHEARTSMAP online psychosocial self-screening tool, children, youth, and (or) their parents, can learn about which aspects of their mental health may be of concern and might benefit from support resources, and where to find them in BC.

Learning about our children's needs will **help guide our provincial mental health resource planning.**

- Parents with a child aged 6-17 in BC

The Interior Design Department at BCIT offers an Interior Design Fundamentals **Certificate**, Kitchen and Bath Design **Associate Certificate** (NKBA Certified), Residential Interiors **Diploma**, Interior Design **Diploma**, and a CIDA accredited **Bachelor of Interior Design**. All Interior Design Programs start with the Interior Design Fundamentals Certificate (Year 1).

The Interior Design Fundamentals Certificate program is offered in both a part-time and full-time format. The **part-time** format allows students flexibility in the number of courses they take in any given term. All courses are offered in September, January and April, with limited offerings in the summer. Courses can be taken with classes in the day, in the evenings, or at weekends. The **full-time** format is a competitive entry process. Students have a reserved seat as they follow a fixed schedule of courses delivered during the day over three consecutive terms (eleven months), starting in September each year.

Application dates for the full-time format for September 2021 are from April 15th to May 17th, 2021 only.*
