Dear Grade 12 Students and Families,

We have constructed a fairly straight-forward plan for our physically distanced graduation ceremony on June 23rd, 2021. This plan has been created so that we may adhere to the strict protocols and procedures set out by the Provincial Health Office and the Fraser Health Authority pertaining to large gatherings of people.

We have published the filming times for all graduates on our social media platforms. Graduates should arrive at the school dressed in their regalia. There will be no changing facilities available.

Students and their four ticketed guests (guests under 12 do not need a ticket) will be required to report to the front doors of the school 30 minutes prior to their scheduled filming time in full regalia. From the front doors, students will be asked to sanitize their hands at our sanitizing stations and proceed to one of two holding areas where they will be held in alphabetical order until the filming area is ready for their arrival. It is important that while students are in their respective holding areas that they continue to observe physical distancing protocols.

While graduates are waiting in their 'holding' location, immediate family members/guardians who have tickets <u>and</u> are on the guest list may enter the main doors and proceed to the courtyard. Staff members will check ticketed guests into the building; if you are not on the list and not in possession of a ticket, you will not be permitted to access the building. Because we are subject to the strict guidelines for building access, we are not able to accommodate additional guests above and beyond the four previously registered. Prior to entering the





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building, all immediate family members/guardians will be required to sanitize their hands. We appreciate your support and understanding.

From their 'holding' location, graduates will be alphabetized by staff, shown a short video, and guided to stations set up between the gymnastics gym and main gym. Grads and their ticketed guests will be paired up in the hallway so they may enter the gym as a group. Guests will be directed into a separate taped-off area at the north end of the gym while grads make their way to the south end of the gym to prepare for their stage walk. Graduates will cross the stage, stop to receive congratulations from each ACSS administrator, pick up their grad folder from the table, and move their tassel from right to left. They will then pose for a photo with our photographer while holding their folder. Graduates will exit the stage, join their family on the gym floor and be escorted to the north side exterior gym doors where the grad and family will exit the building onto the parking lot to leave for the day. As we continue to adhere to safety protocols, we ask all graduates and families to immediately exit the school and not congregate in the parking lot. We will have staff directing traffic and have hired security to ensure the process is as organized as possible.

We anticipate the filming to be completed by 4:30pm and expect our first wave of grads to take the most time, as we work through our program and get into a groove. We are grateful for everyone's patience as we work to keep our graduates and our staff safe.

Select graduates will be required to return later in the day on June 23rd to complete the remainder of our program. These include our Valedictorian, Graduate of the Year, and Governor General Award recipient. These students have been contacted separately and should expect to be here from 4pm onwards.

We are looking forward to this celebration of our graduates who have successfully completed thirteen years of school and have earned this honourable tribute. We thank you in advance for your support and cooperation.

Grade 8/9 Academic Skill Builder Classes

These classes (previously called Academic Remedial classes) are intended for students who have already taken the course and received a mark of at least 35%, but have not met the learning outcomes or have only done so at a minimal level. These classes are not intended for students who have no previous experience in the course at that grade level, or for students wishing to "preview" a course before they have already taken it. Because it is a shorter version of the course, students will be able to earn the course credit and a maximum mark of 61% (C).

Registration - Current Langley School District Students - May 10 to June 25

Summer Session 2021 registration in the Langley School District opens May 10, 2021 and closes on June 25, 2021 for students currently enrolled in School District 35 (Langley). Registrations in available classes are processed in the order the registration occurs, on a "first-come, first-served basis".



Registration - For students who live in Langley (City or Township) but who are not currently enrolled in School District 35 (Langley) - May 10 to June 25

For Summer Session 2021, registrations will be accepted for students whose families can verify their primary residence is in the City or Township of Langley, even if they are not currently enrolled in School District 35. Students can register online. Then, after registration, families will be contacted by e-mail with information about how to process their request and also to confirm their residency. Please note that providing an address of a family member or friend who resides in Langley does not qualify as verifying a student's primary place of residence.

Non School District #35 students and non-Langley residents / students — Registration NOT Available —

For Summer Session 2021, School District 35 will NOT be accepting registrations for students who are not currently registered in the Langley School District or whose primary residence is not in Langley.

Information Required When Registering

- Student's Personal Education Number (PEN), student's legal and English name if different, phone number(s), address, and parent guardian(s) name(s) and e-mail address.
- If a student was not registered in the Langley School District for the 2020/21 school year, a completed registration form, proof of parent/guardian(s) citizenship and BC residency plus the student's birth certificate must be provided.
- · As noted above, for students not currently enrolled in School District 35, proof of address in Langley is required.

International Students

- Secondary International students already registered in the Langley School District must contact their International Student Program (ISP) Coordinator at their current school before registering in Summer Session classes for full information regarding payment options and to confirm homestay arrangements.
- International students can register for their course online outlined above and will be able to
 make their payments and complete their registration through their current school.
- All International students are subject to course fees as outlined on the front of this brochure. Payment of course fees must be made within 7 days of registration.
- International students withdrawing from courses are subject to a 10% processing fee.
 Refunds are not given after the first day of Summer Session 2021.
- International students not currently enrolled in the Langley School District for the current school year cannot enroll in Summer Session 2021.

Information About School Status During Inclement Weather

Snow closures and power outages are an annual occurrence in Langley School District. So, where do you go to get information about the status of schools during periods of inclement weather? If you are able to access the internet via computer or smartphone, current information about Langley schools can be accessed on all school websites or www.sd35.bc.ca. Updates are also posted to Twitter @LangleySchools and Facebook at www.facebook.com/ langleyschooldistrict. If you don't have internet connectivity but your phone is working, call a relative or friend in an area that has not been affected by the storm and ask them to check the district website for you. Local radio stations are also informed of school status in Langley. Tune in to CKWX 1130AM, CKNW 980AM, Country Radio 107.1FM, Pulse 107.7 or CBC 690AM or 88.1FM for updates.

Please note that Langley District schools are all considered 'open' until a decision to close is required. Decisions on school closures are usually made by 6:30am. As always, it is a parent's decision whether to send their child to school based on safety and individual circumstances. If you feel it is unsafe for you or your child to travel to or attend an open school for any reason, please keep your child home and report an absence to the school.





Fraser Health COVID-19 School Update – Immunization for 12-17 year olds

Health Canada has approved the use of the Pfizer vaccine for youth aged 12 to 17. British Columbia is expanding the COVID-19 Immunization Plan to include this age group.

Youth are excited to protect themselves and their families.

Children aged 12 to 17 can register to get vaccinated now by going to www.gov.bc.ca/getvaccinated, calling 1-833-838-2323 or in person at any Service B.C. centre. Once child(ren) are registered in the provincial system they will be contacted at a later date via the method they indicated (either email or text) to book their vaccine appointment.

Household and group vaccination options are also available to make it easy for households to be immunized at the same time. Multiple young people in a household can attend one booked appointment and be vaccinated together. Young people accompanying adults to the adult's new vaccine appointment can register on site and do not need to be registered or booked in advance. Just let clinic staff know you have arrived.

Ensure all family members bring identification and ideally, their personal health card if they have one.

In the coming days, schools will receive an information package to be shared with families with key information such as how to prepare for and what to expect during your child's vaccine appointment.

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Enhanced Safety Measures for K-12 Schools

The District appreciates all the hard work from students, staff, and families in helping keep our community safe. We continue to work closely with the Ministry of Education and Provincial Health Office. This week the province announced changes to COVID-19 health and safety guidelines for schools. Mask requirements for middle and secondary school students and K-12 staff have been amended. Guidelines have also been strengthened for physical education and music classes.

It is important to note, our schools will need some time to implement these new changes; all changes will be in effect as of February 26, 2021. Your continued patience and support are appreciated. If you have any questions, please contact the school.

Please read below and full details found in the province's news release located on the District website here.

Changes to Mask Wearing

All middle and secondary students and K-12 staff will now be required to wear non-medical masks in all indoor areas, including when they are with their learning groups. The only exceptions are when:

- sitting or standing at their seat or workstation in a classroom;
- there is a barrier in place; or
- they are eating or drinking.

For elementary students, wearing masks indoors remain a personal choice.

It is important to note, as advised by the province, these changes above do not apply to grade 6 and 7 students attending an elementary school.

Changes to Physical Education and Music Classes

High-intensity physical activities are to be held outside as much as possible. Shared equipment or items, such as weight machines, treadmills or musical instruments, can be used only if they are cleaned between use, according to strict school sanitization guidelines. Students using equipment or playing instruments should also be spaced at least two metres apart and masks are to be used when singing.
