

Grade 8/9 Academic Skill Builder Classes

These classes (previously called Academic Remedial classes) are intended for students who have already taken the course and received a mark of at least 35%, but have not met the learning outcomes or have only done so at a minimal level. These classes are not intended for students who have no previous experience in the course at that grade level, or for students wishing to "preview" a course before they have already taken it. Because it is a shorter version of the course, students will be able to earn the course credit and a maximum mark of 61% (C).

Registration - Current Langley School District Students - May 10 to June 25

Summer Session 2021 registration in the Langley School District opens May 10, 2021 and closes on June 25, 2021 for students currently enrolled in School District 35 (Langley). Registrations in available classes are processed in the order the registration occurs, on a "first-come, first-served basis".



Registration - For students who live in Langley (City or Township) but who are not currently enrolled in School District 35 (Langley) - May 10 to June 25

For Summer Session 2021, registrations will be accepted for students whose families can verify their primary residence is in the City or Township of Langley, even if they are not currently enrolled in School District 35. Students can register online. Then, after registration, families will be contacted by e-mail with information about how to process their request and also to confirm their residency. Please note that providing an address of a family member or friend who resides in Langley does not qualify as verifying a student's primary place of residence.

Non School District #35 students and non-Langley residents / students — Registration NOT Available —

For Summer Session 2021, School District 35 will NOT be accepting registrations for students who are not currently registered in the Langley School District or whose primary residence is not in Langley.

Information Required When Registering

- Student's Personal Education Number (PEN), student's legal and English name if different, phone number(s), address, and parent guardian(s) name(s) and e-mail address.
- If a student was not registered in the Langley School District for the 2020/21 school year, a completed registration form, proof of parent/guardian(s) citizenship and BC residency plus the student's birth certificate must be provided.
- · As noted above, for students not currently enrolled in School District 35, proof of address in Langley is required.

International Students

- Secondary International students already registered in the Langley School District must contact their International Student Program (ISP) Coordinator at their current school before registering in Summer Session classes for full information regarding payment options and to confirm homestay arrangements.
- International students can register for their course online outlined above and will be able to make their payments and complete their registration through their current school.
- All International students are subject to course fees as outlined on the front of this brochure. Payment of course fees must be made within 7 days of registration.
- International students withdrawing from courses are subject to a 10% processing fee.
 Refunds are not given after the first day of Summer Session 2021.
- International students not currently enrolled in the Langley School District for the current school year cannot enroll in Summer Session 2021.

Please note that Langley District schools are all considered 'open' until a decision to close is required. Decisions on school closures are usually made by 6:30am. As always, it is a parent's decision whether to send their child to school based on safety and individual circumstances. If you feel it is unsafe for you or your child to travel to or attend an open school for any reason, please keep your child home and report an absence to the school.



Please See Below for a message regarding COVID cases from our Principal

Hello everyone,

As you are aware, our school has received a number of notifications from Fraser Health due to COVID cases in our community. We understand that when multiple cases are reported, people in our community may wonder about the possible connection between cases. Through our work with Fraser Health, we assist in tracing the contacts in each case and do our best to determine whether or not the case is isolated or connected to previous cases in the school or community. Although we have received an influx of notifications recently, the data given to us by Fraser Health does not show widespread connectedness between cases.

Given the number of cases in our community, though, we are connecting further with Fraser Health to see if there is anything else we as a school can be doing to help reduce infections, either in the school or the community.

At the school we continue to maintain protocols of mask-wearing, physical distancing, handwashing and sanitizing. Our custodians have been doing an outstanding job cleaning all areas in the school, including the diligent cleaning, disinfecting and misting of all frequently touched surfaces. While we continue to regularly remind students and staff to follow our school health protocols, we will be increasing our schoolwide announcements emphasizing the need for all of us to be wary of COVID transmission both in the school and in the community.

Understandably, this has been a challenging year for all of us in schools. We would like you to know that we truly appreciate all of your support and understanding. We believe and know that together we can overcome these challenges.

Thank you, and please do remind your children to follow safe protocols of masking, physical distancing and hand-cleaning wherever they are.

Fraser Health COVID-19 School Update – Immunization for 12-17 year olds

Health Canada has approved the use of the Pfizer vaccine for youth aged 12 to 17. British Columbia is expanding the COVID-19 Immunization Plan to include this age group.

Youth are excited to protect themselves and their families.

Children aged 12 to 17 can register to get vaccinated now by going to www.gov.bc.ca/getvaccinated, calling 1-833-838-2323 or in person at any Service B.C. centre. Once child(ren) are registered in the provincial system they will be contacted at a later date via the method they indicated (either email or text) to book their vaccine appointment.

Household and group vaccination options are also available to make it easy for households to be immunized at the same time. Multiple young people in a household can attend one booked appointment and be vaccinated together. Young people accompanying adults to the adult's new vaccine appointment can register on site and do not need to be registered or booked in advance. Just let clinic staff know you have arrived.

Ensure all family members bring identification and ideally, their personal health card if they have one.

In the coming days, schools will receive an information package to be shared with families with key information such as how to prepare for and what to expect during your child's vaccine appointment.

Enhanced Safety Measures for K-12 Schools

The District appreciates all the hard work from students, staff, and families in helping keep our community safe. We continue to work closely with the Ministry of Education and Provincial Health Office. This week the province announced changes to COVID-19 health and safety guidelines for schools. Mask requirements for middle and secondary school students and K-12 staff have been amended. Guidelines have also been strengthened for physical education and music classes.

It is important to note, our schools will need some time to implement these new changes; all changes will be in effect as of February 26, 2021. Your continued patience and support are appreciated. If you have any questions, please contact the school.

Please read below and full details found in the province's news release located on the District website here.

Changes to Mask Wearing

All middle and secondary students and K-12 staff will now be required to wear non-medical masks in all indoor areas, including when they are with their learning groups. The only exceptions are when:

- sitting or standing at their seat or workstation in a classroom;
- there is a barrier in place; or
- they are eating or drinking.

For elementary students, wearing masks indoors remain a personal choice.

It is important to note, as advised by the province, these changes above do not apply to grade 6 and 7 students attending an elementary school.

Changes to Physical Education and Music Classes

High-intensity physical activities are to be held outside as much as possible. Shared equipment or items, such as weight machines, treadmills or musical instruments, can be used only if they are cleaned between use, according to strict school sanitization guidelines. Students using equipment or playing instruments should also be spaced at least two metres apart and masks are to be used when singing.

ELMER HELM YOUTH FUND

Each year, the Alexandra Foundation for Neighbourhood Houses provides financial assistance to deserving students who wish to pursue post-secondary training in the artistic, academic or technical field. Up to eight Elmer Helm Youth Fund awards may be presented, of which a minimum of four will go to new recipients, while up to four may be given to prior recipients who are continuing their undergraduate studies. Each recipient will receive \$1,500.00 in two payments of \$750.00 in early August and January. To be eligible for this award, students must demonstrate they are planning to pursue studies in a certificate or degree program at the college or university level, and must be significantly involved in their community in a volunteer capacity.

This fund is to assist youth who may not have the financial means to participate in achieving their goal of post-secondary education. Students who receive this award are eligible for funding for up to 4 years. The fund is open to young people under the age of 25 years old. This fund is not a primarily academic competition. Of equal importance to academic success is contribution to the community exemplifying the Neighbourhood House ideal of community service and strengthening communities.

Application Procedure:

- 1. A letter from the candidate outlining personal and career goals, and an explanation of why the candidate believes he or she should be selected for the award.
- 2. Three letters of reference from members of the community or from school.
- 3. Documentation regarding academic standing and other accomplishments (i.e. transcripts).
- 4. Contact information (Name, Phone number, address, and Email Address).

The deadline for all applications is Wednesday, June 30, 2021. All applications must be received by 5:00pm on this date.

As a participant of the Youth WORK in Trades program, Sam had a great head start in completing his apprenticeship and obtaining his Red Seal at a young age. The problem-solving part of his job is what he loves most about his career in the skilled trades. Sam also recognizes the importance of building good relationships and enjoys explaining exactly what and why things need to be done to customers during the process. "I love watching and learning from other trades professionals, and most of all I simply love to serve."

Sam is most proud of his relationships: his family who raised him, his community who mentored him, the teachers who instructed him, and the friends who supported him along the way. He says that he would not be where he was today as a Plumber and Gasfitter apprentice at age 20 without the support of all those around him. In 10 years, Sam sees himself owning his own company, embodying the core values and providing top-tier customer service skills that he was taught as a young apprentice. He strives to be a role model that treats others well.

In his spare time, Sam enjoys cooking for friends and playing volleyball with his brothers while chatting late into the night. He also loves to run and trains for marathons during the hours before and after work.

When asked what advice he would give to those who are considering a career in the trades, he encourages folks to just try it out. "Even if you don't decide to pursue that trade two years down the road, it still looks great on a resume and the price of trade school will never be beaten. The skilled trades are always a valuable career, and it never hurts to make yourself valuable as an employee."
