

These classes are "blended" and require students to attend classes in-person two days per week, and work with their teacher online using Moodle and Teams the other three days per week. #### Grade 8/9 Academic Skill Builder Classes

These classes (previously called Academic Remedial classes) are intended for students who have already taken the course and received a mark of at least 35%, but have not met the learning outcomes or have only done so at a minimal level. These classes are not intended for students who have no previous experience in the course at that grade level, or for students wishing to "preview" a course before they have already taken it. Because it is a shorter version of the course, students will be able to earn the course credit and a maximum mark of 61% (C).

#### Registration - Current Langley School District Students - May 10 to June 25

Summer Session 2021 registration in the Langley School District opens May 10, 2021 and closes on June 25, 2021 for students currently enrolled in School District 35 (Langley). Registrations in available classes are processed in the order the registration occurs, on a "first-come, first-served basis".



#### Registration - For students who live in Langley (City or Township) but who are not currently enrolled in School District 35 (Langley) - May 10 to June 25

For Summer Session 2021, registrations will be accepted for students whose families can verify their primary residence is in the City or Township of Langley, even if they are not currently enrolled in School District 35. Students can register online. Then, after registration, families will be contacted by e-mail with information about how to process their request and also to confirm their residency. Please note that providing an address of a family member or friend who resides in Langley does not qualify as verifying a student's primary place of residence.

#### Non School District #35 students and non-Langley residents / students — Registration NOT Available —

For Summer Session 2021, School District 35 will NOT be accepting registrations for students who are not currently registered in the Langley School District or whose primary residence is not in Langley.

#### Information Required When Registering

- Student's Personal Education Number (PEN), student's legal and English name if different, phone number(s), address, and parent guardian(s) name(s) and e-mail address.
- If a student was not registered in the Langley School District for the 2020/21 school year, a completed registration form, proof of parent/guardian(s) citizenship and BC residency plus the student's birth certificate must be provided.
- As noted above, for students not currently enrolled in School District 35, proof of address in Langley is required.

#### International Students

- Secondary International students already registered in the Langley School District must contact their International Student Program (ISP) Coordinator at their current school before registering in Summer Session classes for full information regarding payment options and to confirm homestay arrangements.
- International students can register for their course online outlined above and will be able to make their payments and complete their registration through their current school.
- All International students are subject to course fees as outlined on the front of this brochure. Payment of course fees must be made within 7 days of registration.
- International students withdrawing from courses are subject to a 10% processing fee.
   Refunds are not given after the first day of Summer Session 2021.
- International students not currently enrolled in the Langley School District for the current school year cannot enroll in Summer Session 2021.

Please note that Langley District schools are all considered 'open' until a decision to close is required. Decisions on school closures are usually made by 6:30am. As always, it is a parent's decision whether to send their child to school based on safety and individual circumstances. If you feel it is unsafe for you or your child to travel to or attend an open school for any reason, please keep your child home and report an absence to the school.



Dear Parents/Guardians, Students and Staff:

Re: Information Bulletin

Our District continues to work through challenges imposed on us due to the COVID-19 pandemic. We recognize the provincial and regional landscape with respect to cases isn't improving as quickly as we all would like. But we are hopeful the vaccine roll-out will make an impact on our community.

#### Vaccine Roll-out for Staff

As you know, our K-12 educational staff have been provided the opportunity to get vaccinated in the Fraser Health Authority. We have heard reports from administrators, teachers, and staff who have expressed relief and a sense of optimism. We share these sentiments and are grateful to all staff for their patience and ongoing support with the vaccine roll-out process. It is important to note, staff vaccinations do not change the COVID-19 notification process in our schools or case and contact management by public health. Our schools will continue to follow health and safety procedures. The District continues to take direction from the Fraser Health Authority.

To date, our District has had 236 COVID-19 notifications in 39 of our schools since September. The month of April has been the most challenging thus far. As cases in our schools reflect what's happening in the community, we recognize the effects of the third wave in our province and region and are seeing this impact our school communities.

#### Graduation Celebrations

Under the current COVID-19 restrictions, large scale in-person graduation ceremonies, banquets and prom celebrations cannot go ahead this year due to the provincial ban on gatherings. These restrictions do not permit the same formats of graduation celebrations as last year. As a result, the District is working together with secondary schools to develop potential options but, will wait until after the May long weekend to make a decision on the formats of our graduation celebrations with the hope restrictions may change. We acknowledge this is disappointing for our graduates and their families. Secondary school administrators and staff will continue to look for creative ways to honour our grads this year. Our schools have learned many lessons from last year's grad festivities and have demonstrated repeatedly they are able to adapt. I'm confident our school communities will help make Grad 2021 meaningful and memorable.

#### Moving Forward

Transportation Registration for the 2021-2022 school year opens May 3. Our District has worked hard to improve communications and operations regarding bussing. All categories of riders currently in our transportation system will receive information outlining the registration process. To help in our planning, we ask families to register by June 18. The District cannot guarantee approval of ridership after this deadline. For more information visit our webpage <a href="here">here</a>.

Thank you for continuing to conduct a daily health check with your child. It is an important measure to help keep our school community healthy and safe. 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### **Enhanced Safety Measures for K-12 Schools**

The District appreciates all the hard work from students, staff, and families in helping keep our community safe. We continue to work closely with the Ministry of Education and Provincial Health Office. This week the province announced changes to COVID-19 health and safety guidelines for schools. Mask requirements for middle and secondary school students and K-12 staff have been amended. Guidelines have also been strengthened for physical education and music classes.

It is important to note, our schools will need some time to implement these new changes; all changes will be in effect as of February 26, 2021. Your continued patience and support are appreciated. If you have any questions, please contact the school.

Please read below and full details found in the province's news release located on the District website here.

#### **Changes to Mask Wearing**

All middle and secondary students and K-12 staff will now be required to wear non-medical masks in all indoor areas, including when they are with their learning groups. The only exceptions are when:

- sitting or standing at their seat or workstation in a classroom;
- there is a barrier in place; or
- they are eating or drinking.

For elementary students, wearing masks indoors remain a personal choice.

It is important to note, as advised by the province, these changes above do not apply to grade 6 and 7 students attending an elementary school.

#### **Changes to Physical Education and Music Classes**

High-intensity physical activities are to be held outside as much as possible. Shared equipment or items, such as weight machines, treadmills or musical instruments, can be used only if they are cleaned between use, according to strict school sanitization guidelines. Students using equipment or playing instruments should also be spaced at least two metres apart and masks are to be used when singing.

#### COVID-19 and Youth Mental Health

Since COVID-19 was declared a pandemic, many public health responses have been implemented including social distancing measures and school closures.

These measures may have an impact on the mental health of children and teens, and we need to adjust the type and amount of resources being offered our children.

The MyHEARTSMAP team needs your help to measure how much and in what ways the changes in our lives during the pandemic have affected the social and psychological wellness of our children and youth.

Using the MyHEARTSMAP online psychosocial self-screening tool, children, youth, and (or) their parents, can learn about which aspects of their mental health may be of concern and might benefit from support resources, and where to find them in BC.

Learning about our children's needs will help guide our provincial mental health resource planning.




