All Gr. 11's who need to complete the Numeracy assessment will receive a personal invitation reminding them when they are to write. Please note that the dates will impact their current class.

Advance students will write the Numeracy assessment this session and then the Literacy assessment during the session in April.

All Gr. 11's who need to complete the Literacy assessment will be scheduled during the April session.

During the week of Jan. 25-29<sup>th</sup> all **Gr. 10 students** who are currently taking a Numeracy or Literacy class (in Quarter 2) will be scheduled to complete a Provincial Assessment. 

### **Student Safety Around Schools**

With the days growing shorter and the weather changing to rain, fog, and frost, Aldergrove Community Secondary is reminding all our students to take extra precaution when walking to and from school. Please be aware of your surroundings, walk on the sidewalk and with someone whenever possible, and avoid wearing headphones. We also ask drivers in our school community to be vigilant on our roads. Student safety is our priority. Thank you for your cooperation and support in keeping everyone safe.

#### Information About School Status During Inclement Weather

Snow closures and power outages are an annual occurrence in Langley School District. So, where do you go to get information about the status of schools during periods of inclement weather? If you are able to access the internet via computer or smartphone, current information about Langley schools can be accessed on all school websites or <a href="www.sd35.bc.ca">www.sd35.bc.ca</a>. Updates are also posted to Twitter @LangleySchools and Facebook at <a href="www.facebook.com/langleyschooldistrict">www.facebook.com/langleyschooldistrict</a>. If you don't have internet connectivity but your phone is working, call a relative or friend in an area that has not been affected by the storm and ask them to check the district website for you. Local radio stations are also informed of school status in Langley. Tune in to CKWX 1130AM, CKNW 980AM, Country Radio 107.1FM, Pulse 107.7 or CBC 690AM or 88.1FM for updates.

Please note that Langley District schools are all considered 'open' until a decision to close is required. Decisions on school closures are usually made by 6:30am. As always, it is a parent's decision whether to send their child to school based on safety and individual circumstances. If you feel it is unsafe for you or your child to travel to or attend an open school for any reason, please keep your child home and report an absence to the school.

#### **School Immunizations**

The District has been advised by Fraser Health that school immunizations are expected to take place in January. As in previous years, students in grades 6 and 9 will have the opportunity to be vaccinated. Fraser Health will also provide catch up immunizations to students who did not complete their immunizations last year or over the summer. There are 55 BC Excellence Scholarships available to recognize well-rounded B.C. graduates. Winners will have demonstrated service and leadership, both at school and in their communities, and shown aptitude and commitment to their chosen career paths. They will receive a \$5000 scholarship voucher to use for post-secondary tuition.

# Nomination and Application

You must be nominated by your secondary school in order to apply for this scholarship. Only one student from each school may be nominated.

# Eligibility

#### Nominees must:

- Be in their graduation year with graduation to occur by August 31 of the school year in which they are nominated
- Be eligible for a B.C. Certificate of Graduation (Dogwood Diploma) and fulfill graduation requirements.
- Have at least a:
  - "B" (73% or above) in their Language Arts 11 final mark
  - "B" average in final course marks that fulfill graduation requirements of Science 11 or 12, Math 11 and Social Studies 11 or 12, with no more than one "C+" (67% or above) final course mark, (marks lower than "C+" are not accepted)
- Maintain a "B" average or better in Grades 11 and 12 final course marks required for graduation

The following must submitted to Mrs. Luteijn for consideration by Jan. 24th.

- Resume
- Two reference letters, one from your community and one from your school
- · A written statement, maximum 500 words, which must describe:
  - What led you to your most relevant community service, volunteer activity, and/or leadership role, and
  - What you learned from this experience, and
  - How this experience will benefit you in your chosen career path.

The school's nominee will notified and directed to fill out an online application. The application must be submitted to the Ministry before Feb. 28<sup>th</sup>.
