Langley Secondary is a public high school in Langley, British Columbia part of School District 35 Langley. It is the oldest secondary school in the Langley School District, having been opened in 1949. Langley Secondary offers a comprehensive academic program for students in Grade 9 to 12 and has strong traditions in the Performing Arts, Fine Arts and Athletics. Langley Secondary has over 1100 students and 120 staff members. In addition to regular provincially prescribed curriculum leading to graduation, the school offers academic programs including AVID, ELL, International, Alternate Ed programming, Complex Resource, Train & Trades, Piping & plumbing and 4 Sports Academies.

LSS is genuinely a lively and diverse community. The school welcomes a wide range of backgrounds and offers programs that cater to different socioeconomic, cultural, and academic needs.
