How to apply:

- See your school's Career Advisor
- Complete an application in full and return by the deadline
- Interviews will be held in April
- Students will be advised of their acceptance status by late May in time to register at ACSS for the following school year

- Completion of CofQ Level 2
- Completion of CofQ Level 3
- Accumulation of a total 6,360 workbased training hours
- ITA Standardized Written Exam
- Interprovincial Red Seal Exam

Prerequisites

- Registered in at least 3 courses within the Langley School District at the time of application
- Completed Grade 10
- Math 11, strongly recommend Physics 11
- English 11
- Auto 11 or equivalent
- Fully proficient in the English language
- Minimum of 15 years of age and must complete the program before 20 years of age
- Intention to graduate with a Dogwood Diploma

Keys to Success

- Regular attendance and a solid commitment to the program
- Passionate about the Automotive Service Industry demonstrated by a sincere willingness to learn
- Ability to cooperate and communicate effectively with team members
- Good hand-eye coordination and manual dexterity
- Intention to graduate with a Dogwood Diploma

Program Fees

Approximately \$950 - \$550 for textbook and classroom supplies. Students supply steel-toed boots and tools at a cost of approximately \$400. These tools of the trade are kept by students for future use.

Program Savings

KPU tuition is paid by the Langley School District for Langley students registered in this program.

Students requiring financial assistance may qualify for a partial bursary. Please see your School Counsellor for more information.

Graduating Students – Plan Ahead

To be eligible, students who wish to take this program after graduation must be Conditionally Accepted into the program prior to their Grade 12 graduation.

This program starts in second semester.

To remain eligible to participate students must keep their application valid by being registered in a Langley District School for the first semester taking at least 3 courses.
