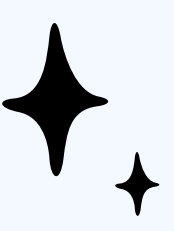

29. Programming Club- Tuesday/Wednesday in Room 0163, Sponsored by Mrs. Ruffini

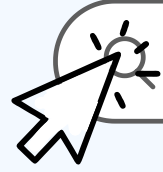
