Principal's Report: Mr. Joo's Update

- 1) Classroom placements aren't finalized for September.

- 3) Our school is small and with that comes challenges with classroom placement. Things like grid requirements set out by the district, classroom size and composition, Individualized Education Plans (IEP's), as well as the diverse needs of our learners, are all taken into account. Much thought and time goes into these placements from teachers and staff; please trust in the process and understand that many factors affect where a student is placed. Feedback from parents on placement/requests will be considered if you feel there is information a teacher may not be aware of, and maybe helpful in the decision making process, but recognizing too, that classroom teachers are working on the complexities of the process and that reasons for placement are often private matters and cannot be explained.

Our school is unique in that kids go in different directions for high school. Even if it is just one students going to see their new high school, or returning for the grad walk, we recognize every student matters and try and make these connections for them.

Special Guest Speaker: Mr. Moino, Assistant Superintendent

- 1) Here to discuss Motion #4 from the June 6th school board meeting.
- 2) This motion dates back to 2019 where 5 motions were being looked into. #4 pertaining to Coghlan and how it aligns with the K-5/K-7 models. We are fundamental, but don't align with the K-5 of Langley fundamental and yet also too, not a catchment school for Poppy although we tend to funnel that direction. Many questions with the complexities of Coghlan were addressed and what to do. Power Point Presentation was given.
- 3) Result: Do nothing. Coghlan is staying as is as there is no clear solution at this time. Things in our district have also changed since this was first presented. Students can enter Fundamental in grade 8 if they choose, go back to their catchment school, or can apply to DW Poppy if they are out of catchment.
