II. School reports:

A. Principal – John Hantke: Not in attendance, by GT

Huge thankyou to PAC for putting on a successful dance, Teachers were nervous about the dance but were reassured that all would go smoothly. There were a few relationship drama fallouts from the dance which surfaced on the Friday.

Thanks to Sarah and all volunteers for help with Breakfast Program, have seen a huge uptake of students coming for breakfast.

Have obtained the master photos from the photo booth from the dance. Will be working on getting them distributed soon. There was a privacy issue with photos being available for all to see.

February is Black History month and Respect and Diversity week is coming up Feb 21st. Will be sending out info in the Scoop of all events which will take place.

Will be putting up Valentine Hearts in the front foyer, 1 for each student. Will have the students name on the front with an encouraging message from their teacher on the back. On Feb 28th, the new School Board Trustees will be coming to the school. Will be showing off the plans for the new Theatre, outside courts and new foods room.

B. Community Coordinator – Kinder Sandher: Not in attendance, by GT

The Ukrainian Family Tea was held last month. Was a success. Thanks to PAC and all volunteers. Great feedback from families that attended. Oleyna from SWIS (Settlement workers in Schools) attended and was the main mediator between admin and families and translators. Great turnout from all feeder schools. There were translators from the Langley City Community Services which were really helpful. Mr. Hantke showed a video on Stafford and our school spirit and all the activities offered. The families got to mingle and ask questions. The main concern that most families had, was if their children would be able to attend University (if their English would be good enough), and were reassured with all the resources available, to make it happen. There were lots of volunteers and for next event will be more specific in duties and times needed. Had many student helpers to set up and decorate for the Tea.

Have started a Chess Club on Monday's afterschool, great turnout by students and may have to put a cap on how many can come.

Wants to start a buddy system with LSS. Every grade 8 student would be linked with a LSS buddy (maybe grade 11). So they can ask question and have a mentor when they start at LSS. Hoping to start a once a month Ukraine Social/ meeting time for families to come and connect. With regards to Respect and diversity week, this year would like to have a day/ evening big event after Spring Break. Details have not been worked out yet between John and Kinder.

1. Feedback

Attendees: 136 Grade sixes, 150 Grade sevens, 96 Grade 8's – Total- 382 Great feedback from parents and students. The DJ Said that Stafford was the best, well behaved school that he has gone to. Students now know what a school dance is and involves and will hopefully be more excited for the next ones. Gift cards were given to the 2 SEA's that were there and helped. There was a sub teacher that came and helped out in the coat check and will get a gift card to him for all his help.

Things that worked: Great DJ & music, good to focus decoration in hallway, tattoo station, SEAs and principal at door, coat check, pizza delivery went smooth, no dress code issues, kids dancing, neon theme was popular, signup genius for volunteers, great poster from Lindsay, the box seats from the theatre were great for having in the hallway,

Things to improve: Reserve gym earlier, finish posters earlier, have more volunteers on entrance at start, add coat check to volunteer list, pizza payment closer to pizza, add executive PAC to specific stations/tasks, more time to give volunteers clear expectations, more men to volunteer, volunteer on garbage detail, have a designated First Aide person, use students for garbage detail at end with prizes, monitor coat check more closely, set up tables at entrance better for students leaving, be ready for more food donations, sell free tickets ahead of time for estimate numbers, maybe charge \$2 to come to dance, Get flyers out to teachers to post on the classroom doors for advertising, no student loitering in coat check area, no student loitering in hawk's nest area.

 Work in partnership for the success of all students: goal is to support all family schools and staff

- Values connections with one another, parents and community partners to meet the mandate of supporting student families and staff.
- 7 school officers plus Julie each officer is assigned a high school and the feeder schools
- Programs: Kids clubs out of elementary, reading club (with LAPS & fire dept.), basketball pilot program underway.
- Regular interaction is important so the students get to know them and there are positive interactions.
- Key goal not to arrest. Last resort. Looking to work with restorative partners to direct kids back onto a positive path.
- Attend community events incredibly important to liaise in a different way. They will try their best to come if invited. Attending Spring Fling and others.
- Magdy Ghobrial Review process to examine and define what students need in the Langley School District. Everybody should feel support from the community. Going to be moving forward with the school community to review everything the SLO program does is being felt. Goal is to ensure all students feel supported.
- Officers are available to introduce themselves, explain SLO program
- PACs are encouraged to share info about SLO program and the liaison officer at their school via newsletters or social media
- Bridging events like "coffee with a cop" or "meet the police" would help foster positive interactions
- Incidents at school involving police and communication to parents are being reviewed on a case by case basis. Privacy, investigation, attention seeking...no one policy is applicable in every situation.

Trustee Report: Trustee Ward

- Committee changes with Joel being signed off. School Liaison officer update. Regular public board meeting next week.
- Strategic education plan meeting was held. Public can attend some of these meetings. A new plan is underway.
- Meetings held with Langley Environment Program (LEAP) i.e., outdoor education. Board
 is recommending that the program become a special academy in the school system –
 very popular with value added benefits and it will also focus on numeracy and literacy.

Superintendent Report - Mal Gill, SD 35 Superintendent

- Meeting with various groups to review the 4 year strategic plan to receive feedback and take it to the education meeting in March. Then at the end of April to the public.
- Uncertified TTOCs short TTOCs in classrooms so VPs and Principals are covering classes. Plans to implement this over the last few months examining Chilliwack (60-70 uncertified) as an example. Langley is continuing to hire, but need to overcome immediate shortage. Intend to max at 10 hires and examine if this could work to support staff, teachers' parents and kids in school. All are term (temp) positions and no uncertified TTOCs can post into permanent positions.
- Collective Agreements moving forward. No job actions. Good news.
- Enhancement Agreement working through this with First Nation.
- Planning for Idea Summit (May 9th) and Idea X (May 23rd).
