Dear Parents/Guardians and Students of Aldergrove Secondary School:

Re: Professional Learning Community (PLC) Time in Schools

The District is sharing important information with students and families regarding semester 2. In alignment with the District's Strategic Plan, schools are continuing to implement strategies to help students embrace high levels of learning and to ensure the success of all students. One of the District's strategies is for schools to function as a Professional Learning Community (PLC), which allows educators to share knowledge and work together on a Response to Intervention (RTI) plan to support students. A Response to Intervention plan could include staff developing strategies for students who may struggle or need additional support, or staff encouraging enhanced opportunities for students who are extending in their learning. For this system to operate as a Professional Learning Community successfully, teachers and staff need appropriate time for collaboration (PLC time) built into the schedule. Some students will be able to use this PLC time to access additional support from teachers, explore new learning opportunities, and extend their learning to help build a stronger school community.

This time for collaboration (PLC time) may impact your child's schedule on designated days. Exact start and end times, as well as additional details specific to your school are included in an attached communication directly from the school's administration.

Re: ACSS Learning Hub Days & Professional Learning Communities (PLC)s

Dear ACSS Parents/Guardians and Students,

We are excited to inform you of a new student and staff initiative for semester 2! As explained in the School District letter, **Professional Learning Communities** (**PLC**)s for educators and Learning Hubs for students are being added this semester to enhance learning across our community.

#### What are Learning Hub for students?

- Learning Hubs are designated tutorial rooms across different areas of the school.
   Learning Hub days are designed for students to have personal choice on where to attend to extend their learning. This differs from our typical format where students stay in RTI daily with their first block teacher. Students will have the opportunity to participate in Learning Hubs eight times during semester 2!
- Learning Hubs are staffed with multiple teachers, peer mentors (Totem Ambassadors)
  and support staff to work with students with personalized supports. Specific classroom
  teachers may not be available; but subject specialists will be available.
- Students are encouraged to sign up to a designated Learning Hub space the week before.
   Drop in spaces will always be open, too!

#### What is a PLC team for teachers?

 While students are in their Learning Hubs: rotating groups of educators will be meeting in Professional Learning Community (PLC) teams. These teams will be working to develop enhanced student learning supports, interventions, and enrichment activities.

#### What does this mean for you as a family?

- School hours are not changing; though, on these 8 days, students will have choice on how they spend this learning time.
- No need to change drop off times: all students are welcome to attend Learning Hub tutorial time, whether they need support in an area, or are interested in extending learning.
- We would like all students and families in our community to have an awareness that this new initiative is happening!

#### PLC/HUB FAQs:

#### What will students do during Hub Time?

Students may choose to access a Learning Hub from 8:45 AM to 9:33 AM on the PLC Day or they can choose to arrive for their first class at 9:37 AM.

#### Are students required to attend Hub Time?

There may be cases where a staff member needs a student to attend a Learning Hub to receive additional support, or to make up missed work. If a student is asked to attend, they are required to be in the Learning Hub

#### If students choose not to attend a Learning Hub, can they still be at the school?

In order to ensure that students and staff can focus on learning, students are required to either be in a Learning Hub or be off-campus. Students are not permitted to hang out in hallways or on campus. Again, students are required to either be in a Learning Hub or be off campus on PLC days.

#### Will clubs, rehearsals, practices etc... be running during Hub Time?

Hub Time is exclusively for students to access Learning Hubs. Outside the timetable classes, rehearsals, practices and clubs will all happen outside of Learning Hub time.

#### Will Breakfast Club be open on PLC/Hub days?

Yes. Breakfast Club will be open as per usual on PLC/Hub days.

#### **SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION**



#### **Grade 9 Immunizations**

On February 15 all Grade 9 students will receive an envelope (specific to their name) with information from Fraser Health about the immunizations that will be taking place at ACSS on Wednesday, February 22. These are regular scheduled immunizations. If you have any questions, it is recommended that you contact Fraser Health. We do not have any further information at the school.

It is requested that a parent or guardian sign the consent form and then students are asked to return the envelope to the main office no later than Friday, February 17. If your child did not receive a form there will be forms for them to complete at the time of immunization.

#### Grade 9 routine immunizations are starting soon at school

#### Public Health will send home an immunization consent package for grade 9 students.

When students are in grade 9 we review their immunization records and offer all routine vaccines they need to be complete for their age.

When the consent package is received:

- ✓ Review the consent package (which will include all immunization history)
- Confirm the immunization record is complete. If it is not complete you can submit the record by:
  - Including it with the signed consent form and returning it to the school
  - Submitting it online to us at: <u>fraserhealth.ca/immunizationform</u>
- ✓ Complete and sign the consent form
- Return the signed consent form to the school sealed in the envelope provided

#### COVID-19 and Influenza (Flu) vaccines


Please note that COVID-19 and Influenza vaccines are only available at COVID-19 and Influenza immunization clinics and will not be offered at the school immunization clinics.


