The Return Schedule/Plan

Students return to our building on the morning of **Tuesday, September 3rd**. For the first week back, students will return to their last year's teacher (if possible). New students will report to our library for a special orientation.

On the first day of school:

- New students should report to the library where they will have an introduction to the school. For Wednesday, these students will be assigned to a class based on which grade they were in last year.
- Kindergarten students will follow the Gradual Entry schedule that was sent out separately. This schedule will begin on Wednesday, Sept 4th.
- Grade 1-7 students: students will go to their previous teacher (please see info below)

Students/families should report to the appropriate and designated exterior classroom door.



Wednesday, Sept 4th (Full day for students 8:20 AM – 2:08 PM): Until new classes are official formed, students will continue to report to the teacher/classroom they had last year.

Thursday, September 5th (Full day for students 8:20 AM – 2:08 PM) - Transitioning Students to Tentative New Classes: Students report to the same classroom/teacher as Tuesday and Wednesday. At some point before recess, teachers will help transition students to their new tentative classes with the assistance of non-enrolling staff, Kitteringham, and SEAs. Students will be in their new tentative classrooms for the bulk of September 5th but will finish their day back in their original classroom from last year for dismissal. Kitteringham will go on the PA around 2 PM and students will be instructed to go back to their original classroom so parents can successfully pick up their children. The intention is to have a familiar face (teacher from last year) at the exterior classroom door at dismissal to help answer questions and facilitate the transition. Students will report to their new tentative classroom starting Friday, September 6th.

Fort Langley Elementary School Info and Expectations

BIKES, SCOOTERS, HEELYS, ROLLERBLADES, AND SKATEBOARDS

Students are not allowed to actively use or ride these on school property. Students should be walking with these items. Bikes need to be stored in the bike racks and a lock is strongly recommended. Helmets are mandatory.

STUDENTS LEAVING EARLY AND PARENTS DROPPING THINGS OFF

If someone other than the person listed at the office is picking up your child, please let the office or your child's teacher know. We will not release a child unless we have parent/guardian confirmation either in written form or by phone. If a student needs to leave early, please inform the classroom teacher by writing a note in your child's agenda. Upon arrival, please sign your child out at the office and we will determine the optimal way to connect you with your child. If you need to drop something off for your child (lunch, shoes...etc.) please just leave it at the office. DO NOT DELIVER TO THE CLASSROOM OR WALK THOUGH THE HALLWAYS. Please leave items at the office and students will be called to the office during breaks to pick up their item. Teachers prefer to not be disturbed during lesson times.

LEAVING SCHOOL GROUNDS

Students are not permitted to leave the school grounds during the school day unless a note is provided by a parent. Students are not permitted to leave the school grounds to go the store at any time.

POKEMON CARDS AND DRONES

The trading of Pokémon cards has caused significant conflict and has also disrupted learning in the past. Pokémon cards should not be out during instructional times and are subject to confiscation after multiple warnings.

PARENT CONCERNS/PROTOCALS

At F.L.E. we follow the BCTF Code of Ethics. If a concern arises about your child, the first step is to speak with the classroom teacher to resolive any issues regarding your child. If you believe the matter requires further discussion or action, please contact the Principal as a secondary step.





Fort Langley **Elementary School** Info and Expectations

BEFORE AND AFTER SCHOOL SUPERVISION

Staff playground supervision begins at 8am. Please do not drop your child off or send students to school prior to 8am. It is important that students leave the school grounds after school (unless they are attending an afterschool activity) as there is no staff supervision on the playgrounds or fields after

BEGINNING OF THE SCHOOL DAY

Students are expected to line up at the exterior door to their class once the bell goes. Teachers will let students in at this time.

STUDENT ABSENCES

If your child is going to be absent, please contact the school. We ask that you keep your child at home if they are not well. Students cannot learn if they are ill, and we don't want to see this illness spread to others. If your child is away and we have not heard from their parent/guardian, you will receive a message from School Messenger.

LATE ARRIVALS

We know at times being late can happen, however we expect all students to be at school, prepared for learning, and on time. Upon arrival, parents/guardians need to sign students in at the main office. Late students should report to their exterior class door and should not walk through the interior of the

ELECTRONIC DEVICES AND STUDENT CELL PHONES

ALL ELECTRONIC DEVICES other than school district devices that are used for instructional purposes are prohibited during the school day. This includes before school, recess, and lunch. If parents want their child to have a cell phone it must be turned off and placed in their backpack. In some circumstances, students might be able to use their device during instructional time but only after asking permission from their classroom teacher. Students who choose to use their cell phone inappropriately will have their cell phone taken from them and parents will be asked to pick it up at the office. Please note that all electronic devices brought to school are at students' and parents' own risk. The school holds no responsibility for damaged, lost, or stolen items.

TAKING AND POSTING PHOTOS

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Inappropriate use of technology in school may result in disciplinary action. Students may not use cameras of any kind without staff supervision at the school. Students cannot take pictures of other students unless under the direction of staff. Photos of others cannot be posted online or sent to others. Only the school, after the media release forms have been completed by families, has the authority to



Parent Consent Request



Administrative Procedure 350 - Appendix A

STUDENT USE OF PERSONAL DIGITAL DEVICES

Background

This procedure outlines the expectations and guidelines for the use of personal digital devices within Langley School District schools.

The Langley School District recognizes the importance of establishing clear guidelines to ensure that personal digital devices are used in a way that supports educational goals and maintains a safe and respectful learning environment. The procedure is necessary to:

- Address the potential distractions and classroom management issues posed by personal digital devices, as well as other negative impacts, such as student addiction to digital technology.
- Provide a framework for the responsible use of technology that aligns with the District's educational objectives and values, as per the District's <u>AP 350: Student Code of</u> Conduct
- Ensure that all students, regardless of their socioeconomic status, have equitable access to learning resources and opportunities.
- Accommodate students with diverse needs, including those with medical conditions that
 may require the use of personal digital devices.
- Foster digital citizenship among students, teaching them to use technology ethically, responsibly, and effectively.
- All students and staff are expected to adhere to the Langley School District's <u>AP 140:</u>
 <u>Computer Access to Electronic Information</u>, <u>AP 140 Appendix A: Appropriate Use</u>, and <u>AP 140 Appendix B: Next Generation Network (NGN) Acceptable Use Standards</u>. The Administrative Procedures outline the standards for acceptable use of technology in the Langley School District, ensuring that technology is used in a safe, responsible, and ethical manner.

Procedures

- 1. Restrictions on Use in Elementary and Middle Schools
 - 1.1. At the discretion of the school Administration, personal digital devices are not to be used during non-instructional times, from the student's arrival at the start of the day, to the student's departure at the end of the day. This includes during recess, lunch, and


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- other breaks. Students are encouraged to keep their personal digital devices at home. Any devices brought to school should be turned off and stored away in backpacks or lockers.
- 1.2. During hours of instruction, personal electronic devices must be turned off and stored away in backpacks or lockers, unless otherwise permitted by school staff for instructional purposes.
- 1.3. School staff may provide alternate means of storage in the classroom, such as with "hanging wall phone pockets" or other storage options. These alternate means of storage should be in a lockable closet or cabinet, or other lockable and secure area.
- 1.4. Overall, the use of school digital devices for instructional purposes is encouraged to enhance digital literacy skills. Staff will guide students on how to integrate these devices into their learning effectively and responsibly.
- 1,5. In support of developing responsible use of technology, classroom teachers are encouraged to start the school year or course by co-constructing classroom norms with students that include the acceptable use of technology in the classroom.
- 1.6. The use of cell phones or other electronic devices, including cameras, to capture pictures, video or audio that records other students or staff may only be done with specific prior consent from Administration. Possible educational uses of audio, picture or video recording could be to take a picture of notes on a board, to record video for a project or assignment, or to record audio for a music or language class, etc. At no time may cameras be used in locker rooms and washrooms.
