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PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Gator Families,

The past two weeks at WGSS have been very eventful. Coming off the Thanksgiving weekend, we had our informal Learning Update Day to provide students and their families with an early snapshot around their progress. A few days later, our staff and students participated along with many other schools across the district and province in the Great BC Shake Out Earthquake Drill. These safety drills are an important part of doing our best to prepare for an emergency. This week, we hosted our first set of parent-teacher interviews for this school year. We appreciate all the families that were able to come to WGSS and connect with our teachers about student learning. It is important that we have these opportunities to connect and work together to support student learning and success. As always, if you ever have questions or concerns about your child's learning you can reach out to your child's teacher at any time.

The upcoming two weeks will be very busy. Next Friday is Halloween. While the day is an exciting one, full of creative costumes, there are some guidelines to be aware of. We want to make sure everyone gets to experience the holiday in a safe and enjoyable way. In general, all Halloween costumes are expected to align with Langley School District's [Student Code of Conduct & Dress Guidelines](#). For safety reasons, we need to be able to see students faces, so full-faced masks or costumes that completely hide the person are not permitted. This is also true of replica or fake weapons of any kind. Finally, it is important for us to remember that cultures and genders are not costumes. All costumes must be culturally appropriate, which prohibits reinforcing stereotypes, and not involve the altering of skin colour. We want all our Gators to feel respected without worrying about someone parodying our culture or gender identity. Please keep this in mind as you plan your family's costumes.

The following week sees us entering the month of November. For the entire week, we will be hosting Provincial Graduation Assessments (Literacy 10, Numeracy 10 & Literacy 12). Every student must complete these three assessments in order to meet graduation requirements. This session will focus on getting Grade 10 & 12 students in Semester 1 English classes to complete Literacy 10 or 12 assessments. A schedule of times can be found later in the Gator News. To finish off the week, we will be hosting our Fall Music Concert on Thursday evening, where our choral and band students can showcase their learning and talents. Friday will be a busy day, as we host several Post Secondary Institutions in the morning for our grade 12 students. As well, we will be reflecting and remembering together as a school community at our Remembrance Day assemblies. Our student and staff team have done a wonderful job of putting together an assembly that will honour our veterans and the sacrifices that they have made.

AP EXAM REGISTRATION

AP Exam Registration runs from October 16th to October 31st. Information can be found on our website under the student life tab.

Students currently enrolled in an AP course will be able to pay for exams on School Cash Online starting Oct 16th.

Students not currently enrolled in an AP course, can register for an AP Exam by filling in the AP Exam Request form and following the directions on our website.

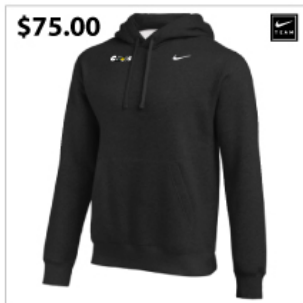

ATTENTION GRAD 2026 FAMILIES!

What is a Dry Grad?

- Dry Grad Event immediately follows the Grad Dinner Banquet (this year it is on June 23, 2026, at Aria Banquet Hall).
- Dry Grad is organized & supervised by parents to ensure grads can continue to celebrate their achievement in a safe, fun way.
- The WGSS teachers & administrators are not involved in planning Dry Grad, but the school does support the event.
- Activities at a Dry Grad may include professional performers, dancing, movies, inflatable events, arcade or carnival attractions or open mike & prizes.
- Dry Grad ticket prices are subsidized by parent fundraising efforts and are a separate cost to the Dinner Banquet. No grad will be left behind due to cost.
- All graduates and guests are required to sign a waiver prior to purchasing a Dry Grad ticket. Ticket sales are typically in the spring after all fundraising is completed.

Where can parents/guardians help?

A committee of parents/guardians meet monthly to plan and budget for the WGSS Dry Grad each year and the positions are:

- Chairperson, Treasurer, Fundraising, Activity Booker, Décor Doers, Food Planners, Transportation, Communications, Volunteer Coordinator, etc.

- Supporting fundraising efforts
- Volunteering for bigger fundraising events
- Volunteering at the official Dry Grad event

REPORTING AN ABSENCE

The school uses an automated absence reporting system called SafeArrival, offered through SchoolMessenger. With SafeArrival, you are asked to report your child's absence in advance using any of these three convenient methods:

1. **SchoolMessenger App** – Using your mobile device, download and install the SchoolMessenger app from the Apple App Store or the Google Play Store. The first time you use the app, select “Sign Up” to create your account. You must use the same email address and phone number that is on file at the school. Select “Attendance” then “Report an Absence”.
2. **SafeArrival Website** – Use the SafeArrival website: <https://go.schoolmessenger.ca>. The first time you use the website, select “Sign Up” to create your account. You must use the same email address and phone number that is on file at the school. Select “Attendance” then “Report an Absence”.
3. **Toll-Free Phone** – Call the toll-free number 1-833-294-4837 to report an absence using the automated phone system. If you are calling the toll-free number, you must call from the parent/guardian phone number on file with the school.

These options are available 24 hours/day, 7 days a week. We ask that daily absences are reported as soon as possible and **before 3:00pm** on the day of the absence. This includes late arrivals and early departures. Future absences can be reported at any time. If absences are not reported before the cut-off time of 3:00pm, the parent/guardian may still receive an automatic notification in the evening to inform them of an absence.

Absences are only to be reported by parents/guardians on file with the school. Students are NOT to report their own absences.

Please report absences using SafeArrival instead of sending notes, calling, or emailing the school. Please use the three options above to report absences. **The school office will no longer accept calls regarding attendance. Parents/guardians will need to report via the app, website, or toll-free number in a timely manner.**

If families have children attending other schools, please continue to report absences using the existing procedures for those schools.

Road and Pedestrian Safety

With less daylight hours and as we enter the season of wind, rain, and ice, we are sharing an important reminder from our community partner ICBC to students, staff, and families to help keep our community safe. Drivers should be alert, focus on the road, watch for pedestrians, especially at intersections and transit stops, and always be ready to stop. Pedestrians and travelers on bikes or scooters should be careful at intersections, always use designated crosswalks, remove headphones and devices, and be aware of your surroundings. Byelection Day - October 25

On Saturday, October 25th, many school gyms across the District will be used as Township of Langley Byelection polling stations from 8am – 8pm. As guided by Section 81 of the Election Act “accommodation in a school that is the property of a board of school trustees under the School Act must be made available by the board for use as a voting place.”

Please take note of extra pedestrian and vehicle traffic in the area of these sites on this day. The District appreciates the support and cooperation from families and members of our community. The District is encouraging everyone who is eligible to do their civic duty and vote. For a list of school sites being used, visit the District website [here](#).

Student in Distress and School Safety

Health and safety are a priority in the Langley School District. Our schools follow procedures to help keep students, staff, and the community safe. Depending on the situation, communication to parents/caregivers is needed to keep families informed about incidents in our school, such as during lockdowns, hold & secures, and room clears, or in the event of a student in distress. Sometimes these situations may not be emergencies but events that require a school response. It is important to note that the decision to send communications to families is dependent on a variety of factors including the nature of what happened, who has witnessed or was directly impacted by what happened, as well as student and staff privacy. Communication is unique and dependent on the specific situation; there are times when a student is in distress, yet the situation may or may not require a message or letter to families. In addition to communication with parents/caregivers, teachers and staff may debrief with students after an incident that may have upset them. In some cases, the school counsellor may offer support to students in need. As always, we want families to let us know if your



child requires support. If you have any questions or concerns about communication related to situations or emergencies, please reach out to the school.

Information About School Status During Inclement Weather

Snow closures and power outages are an annual occurrence in Langley School District. So, where do you go to get information about the status of schools during periods of inclement weather? If you are able to access the internet via computer or smartphone, current information about Langley schools can be accessed on all school websites or www.sd35.bc.ca. Updates are also posted to X (formerly Twitter) @LangleySchools and Facebook at www.facebook.com/langleyschooldistrict. If you don't have internet connectivity but your phone is working, call a relative or friend in an area that has not been affected by the storm and ask them to check the district website for you. Local radio stations are also informed of school status in Langley. Tune in to CKWX 1130AM, CKNW 980AM, Country Radio 107.1FM, Pulse 107.7 or CBC 690AM or 88.1FM for updates.

Please note that Langley District schools are all considered 'open' until a decision to close is required. Decisions on school closures are usually made by 6:30am. As always, it is a parent's decision whether to send their child to school based on safety and individual circumstances. If you feel it is unsafe for you or your child to travel to or attend an open school for any reason, please keep your child home and report an absence to the school.



IMPORTANT PRIVACY REMINDER: RECORDING DEVICES IN SCHOOLS

Guidance for Parents and Students

To protect the privacy and security of all students, staff, and visitors, the Langley School District reminds parents and students that digital recording devices—such as Meta Glasses and AngelSense Trackers—are not permitted at school. This policy is in place to ensure compliance with the BC Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act (FIPPA) and the District's procedures for responsible information management.

Parent Code of Conduct

Our Parent/Guardian Code of Conduct expects every parent and guardian to respect the privacy of other students, parents, caregivers, and staff. Using devices that can discreetly record audio or video, like Meta Glasses or AngelSense Trackers, does not demonstrate respect for others' privacy.

Student Use of Recording Devices

According to Administrative Procedure 350 – Appendix A, students may only use recording devices at school for educational purposes, and only with approval from the principal. Devices such as Meta Glasses and AngelSense Trackers do not meet these requirements and should not be brought to school.

Thank You for Supporting Privacy In Our Schools

For the safety and privacy of our school community, please ensure your child does not bring any discreet recording devices to school. If you have questions, contact your school's office or the district Privacy Officer at privacy@sd35.bc.ca.

Grade 9 Immunizations

Grade 9 immunizations will take place in the Half Cafeteria on November 19. Consent forms will be sent home a few weeks prior so please watch for them! For more information, click [here](#) or see flyer below. ***Please note that no flu or COVID-19 vaccinations will be provided at the school.***



School Vaccination Information for Parents

Getting vaccinated on schedule is the best way to protect yourself from many dangerous diseases. Public health regularly checks immunization records for students in Grades 6-12 to help make sure they are up to date on vaccines.

We offer all routine vaccines needed for students in Grades 6-12 when students are in school.

Families can check their child's immunization records online to see if they need any vaccines by logging into immunizationconsent.gov.bc.ca/s/ then looking at "Immunization forecast".



Give consent for the child's vaccines online

This year, students, parents, or caregivers of students in Grades 6-12 have the option to provide consent for vaccines online. **You can fill out consent now or any time before the school clinic.**

To give online consent for immunizations, scan this QR code or go to immunizationconsent.gov.bc.ca/s/.



If vaccines are needed, please see [Vaccines | HealthLink BC](#) for more information on the specific vaccine your child needs.

Parents, students or caregivers who complete the online consent, will receive a letter closer to the time of school immunizations so you are aware of when the school clinic is occurring.

If consent is not completed online, students will receive a letter and paper consent form from the school close to the time of immunization. The letter will let you know when the consent needs to be returned by.

What if the child had vaccines but they are not on their immunization record?

If the child's record is missing vaccines they already had, please do the following:

1. Find the paper record at home, if one was given to you at the time of vaccination.
2. If you do not have records at home, contact the health care provider who gave the vaccines and ask for a copy of the immunization record.
3. Report the immunizations either of these ways:
 - Submit it online by either scanning this QR code or going to FraserHealth.ca/immunizationform.

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Keep Your Children Free From Respiratory Illnesses This Winter

As the weather gets colder and we spend more time indoors, we're more likely to get sick with things like colds, flu or COVID-19 because these illnesses spread more easily in enclosed spaces. Everyone should take these steps to protect themselves and limit the spread of respiratory illnesses:

- Get vaccinated for flu and COVID-19 if you are eligible.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water. Use alcohol-based sanitizer if soap and water is not available.
- Avoid touching your face, especially your eyes, mouth and nose.
- Cough and sneeze into your elbow.
- If you have flu-like symptoms, stay home and away from people at higher risk of serious illness. If you are sick and cannot stay away from others, wear a mask. Learn more about masks [here](#).

Vaccinations for Respiratory Illness

Vaccinations prepare our immune system to recognize and respond to viruses. When children get immunized, they are less likely to get sick or pass along illness to others and better able to focus on learning, playing and doing the activities they love.

Register your children with the [Get Vaccinated](#) system so you can be reminded to get flu or COVID-19 vaccinations when they are due. Seasonal respiratory vaccinations are available from pharmacies, public health units and some primary care providers.

School-Aged Immunizations

As children get older, the protection from some [infant immunizations](#) can wear off. To set young people up for long-term health and well-being, vaccines are offered routinely in kindergarten, gr 6 and gr 9 with catch-up opportunities in other grades. Getting your child vaccinated on schedule is one of the best ways to protect their health.

All routine school-aged immunizations are free in British Columbia. If your child is not up-to-date with their vaccines, please make an appointment with a public health unit, family doctor, nurse practitioner or pharmacy. If your child's record shows their vaccines are not current, but they did get vaccines from a health care provider outside of public health:

- Contact the health care provider who immunized your child and ask for a copy of the immunization record.
