## Pickup and Dropoff at Gordon Greenwood

# GORDON GREENWOOD ELEMENTARY SCHOOL PARKING LOT & DRIVE THROUGH INFORMATION

- The area closest to the school is a pickup and drop off lane ONLY, similar to the configuration you've likely seen at an airport. No parking and/or waiting will be allowed at any time in this lane. This also applies at the end of the day for pickup of students.
- The critical congestion times are 8:30-8:45 a.m. and 2:25-2:45 p.m. Please be mindful of these times when planning your day and dropping off or picking up your child(ren).
- The middle area is a lane that is for drive through traffic ONLY. Stopping, parking, picking up children or dropping off passengers in this lane is dangerous, inconsiderate, and will not be tolerated.
- Angled parking in front of the school is for staff members only. This will reduce the possibilities for conflicts in the parking lot as these cars generally do not need to be backed up during the most congested periods of the day.

#### If you park or wait in the drop off lane, you risk being towed. You're kidding, right?

**NO**. We're not kidding. You will **NOT** be able to park and leave your car, or park and wait in your car at any point along the front of the school. This will ensure that a steady flow of traffic can circulate in the parking lot safely. **The critical congestion times are 8:30-8:45 a.m. and 2:25-2:45 p.m.** If you need to park and wait for your child(ren), please do so in the parent and visitor parking lot. Thank you in advance for your support.

#### When do these parking and drop off expectations start?

When you arrive on the first day of school, the configuration will be in use.

#### What will happen if I still choose to ignore the new regulations?

Our administrative and teaching staff on morning and afternoon supervision duty, wearing bright orange vests, will let you know if you're acting in an unsafe manner or in a manner that is contrary to our parking and drive through expectations. Your respect for our staff who are out on supervision in the interest of the safety of our students and families is requested and appreciated.


# But I HAVE to drive. What am I supposed to do in September? Consider these options:

- drop your child off a few minutes earlier or pick them up a few minutes later when congestion has eased. The level of supervision before and after school is comparable to recess or lunch time. Please feel that your students are safe for a few minutes while traffic eases. Even ten minutes makes a huge difference to the amount of congestion in the lot.
- if your children are older, have them walk to a set meeting point away from the congested area at the front of the school.
- park outside of the parking lot and walk in. You'll feel less stressed, get some fresh air, and be acting as a positive role model for your children.

#### How were these parking & drop-off procedures decided on?

These improvements were the result of many months of research and assessment by the Gordon Greenwood Elementary Safer School Travel Committee. This committee has had input from the School Administration, parent volunteers, the School District, and the Township of Langley's Engineering Department. Yes, change is difficult – but these measures are being implemented with the interest of improving safety for our students, staff, and families. - 3. Complete this online Volunteer Safety Check Application Form <u>HERE</u>.
- 4. For the convenience of volunteers and to meet the timely needs of the school, the District is offering TWO options to get your Police Information Check (PIC, formerly called a Criminal Record Check/CRC).
  - For volunteers who want a more timely response with a "volunteer letter" from the school, please go to the nearest RCMP Detachment. This can include RCMP Community Policing Offices. If you live in Langley, these checks can often be done on the same day, and sometimes even within 10-15 minutes.
  - For volunteers who have more time and prefer to apply online, we have a link below you can use. Please be sure to show two pieces of government-issued ID to the school Administrator, and please understand that this could take 3-4 weeks before we get back a response.

Please ensure that the results are brought/sent to the school where you will be volunteering. A PIC/CRC "clearance" must be given to the District BEFORE you can begin to volunteer in the Langley School District.

# **Emergency Procedures in Schools**

Schools follow emergency procedures and practice drills throughout the year to ensure students, staff, and any visitors at our sites are safe when unexpected incidents happen. The District encourages families to become familiar with emergency procedures to help you and your child be prepared. You will find the District's Emergency Procedures poster in schools and on the website <u>here</u>.

# **Community Volunteers in Emergencies**

Emergencies can happen unexpectedly due to weather events (e.g., earthquake or flooding) or unforeseen situations in the community. The health and safety of students, staff, and families is the District's priority. The District, together with schools, follow emergency procedures to respond to incidents as well as prevent them from happening. As stated in the provincial **Emergency Management Planning Guide for Schools, Districts and Authorities**, staff have a legal "duty of care," meaning that they "must ensure that students are cared for until such time as they can be safely reunited with their parents." Depending on the situation, the school may be caring for students for many days.

In these circumstances, schools may rely on members of the community to assist with emergency responses. Administrators may send a request to parents/guardians to help volunteer with first aid, facilities and maintenance, safety and security, and general labour. Adults with special skills in health care, policing, and engineering would be an asset in an emergency. No action is needed from families at this time as the purpose is to keep families informed.


