# Expectations to Graduate

DW Poppy takes graduation seriously. In order to participate in the Graduation Ceremony at DW Poppy Secondary, students must have taken enough credits, and be in a position to pass their remaining courses.

Student attendance and behaviour throughout the year is also taken into consideration when we review the names of students who will be participating in the Graduation ceremony.

Should students not be in a position to graduate, grade 12 students *may* still be allowed to participate in the school's Graduation Prom event *with permission* from administration.

## Graduation Capstone Project

A Capstone is a culminating project, presentation, or performance that allows students the opportunity to consolidate and showcase their learning from their school and life experiences into a meaningful and relevant product. Students will use innovation, cross curricular knowledge, and critical thinking skills in an area of interest as the basis for the project, which is applicable to a real-world concept.

The Capstone will:

- Help students make connections between what they are learning now and what they hope to see in their future.
- Provide students with focused, structured, authentic, and experiential learning; responsibility for meeting timelines, making decisions, conducting research, preparing and making presentations – all transferable skills needed for success in the workplace.
- Identify a new opportunity, either for an existing entity or for the creation of a new venture; and implement the necessary skills they have built to launch their own entrepreneurial proposal, research project, service pursuit, event or product.
- Ensure students meet the BC Ministry graduation competencies (Communication, Creative and Critical Thinking, Personal and Cultural Identity, Personal Awareness and Social Responsibility) through the development of the following skills:
  - Effective communication (oral and written)
  - Public Speaking
  - Research Skills
  - Media Literacy
  - Teamwork
  - Planning and Organization
  - Self-awareness and Advocacy
  - Goal Setting
  - Time Management
  - Networking and mentorship relationships
  - Problem Based Learning and Inquiry
  - Presentation skills

- Grad Dinner-Dance tickets will be sold online only and will be available for pick up May 12-23 @ lunch only in the Counselling Center. Students must bring their receipt with them to pick up their tickets.
- The ticket price includes a buffet dinner, dessert, unlimited pop, DJ, facility rental and decorations, security & gratuities. More information about how to purchase tickets online will be released in the spring.
- Students may purchase as many tickets as they wish. Family members are welcome and encouraged to attend.
- Students will reserve their tables when they pick up their tickets; students who do not pick up their tickets will be assigned to a random table so buy and pick up your tickets early!
- **Approved guest passes are required in order to purchase tickets for any non-Poppy Grad individuals attending as a 'date' or 'guest' with the grad.** Guest passes will be available in the office and must be approved by administration in order to purchase a ticket. More information about guest passes will be discussed at the grad assembly in April
- The event runs from 5:30pm-12:00pm. Students are responsible for arranging their own ride to and from Grad Dinner-Dance.
- Grad Dinner-Dance is a school-event and so all school rules apply. Students arriving under the influence or possession of drugs or alcohol will not be permitted entry into prom. All Grad 2025 events are **non-smoking** and **non-vaping** events.
- A reminder that Grad Dinner-Dance is a **formal event** and attire should reflect this.
- There are no in and out privileges at the event.
- At the end of the evening, transportation to Dry Grad (for those students attending) will be arranged by the Dry Grad Parent Committee. Students not attending Dry Grad must make their own arrangements for pickup at the venue.

**Graduation Convocation**

- Ceremony tickets will be sold online only and will be available for pick up alongside the Grad Dinner-Dance tickets from May 13-24 @ lunch in the Counselling Center. Students must bring their receipt with them to pick up their tickets.
- Ceremony tickets are \$5 each. Each grad may purchase up to 8 tickets. Grads **do not** need to purchase a ticket for themselves.
- People who require extra tickets (beyond the 8 allocated to each student) for the ceremony may purchase remaining tickets online starting June 1<sup>st</sup>.
- The ceremony takes approximately 2-2.5 hours and is therefore not appropriate for babies and small children.
- Grads will be able to pick up caps and gowns June 12-13 in the Counselling Centre. The gown, hat, tassel and red, white and blue stole (which goes around your neck) are yours to keep and do not need to be returned.
- Seating is by general admission, so guests are encouraged to arrive early. Doors will open at 6pm.
- Grads must arrive at the back of the auditorium by 5:45pm. If you would like to take photos in your gown, please arrive earlier.
- Marshalling (line up for the processional) starts at 5:45pm. Guests must be seated by 6:45 and the processional will begin at 6:55 SHARP. **PLEASE BE ON TIME.**
- Please remain for the entire ceremony to celebrate all members of the class of 2024. It is distracting if people leave after their graduate has crossed the stage.
- Our graduation ceremony is a semi-formal, non-smoking and non-vaping event. All school rules are in effect.
