

- ► Career Course Support: CLE 10, CLC 12 and Capstone courses
- Course Registration: Youth Work in Trades, Work And Volunteer Experience (WAVE), and Youth Train in Trades.
- Assistance and Guidance: Youth Train in Trades program application, university/college applications, university/college course registrations, scholarship applications, District Career Event applications, paid or volunteer job applications (resume, cover letter, interview, etc.)
- Advising and Coaching: exploring options for post high school life, post-secondary program & school selections, scholarship research & selection, etc.
- Information and Resources Sharing: Gap year, Military/Policing/Fire Fighting careers, entrepreneurship, travel/study overseas, paid/volunteer job opportunities, District and community career events/programs, etc.

CAREER LIFE CONNECTIONS 12

- Focus of the course is on supporting students in identifying an area of passion that they can pursue after high school, and equipping them with the knowledge and skills needed to navigate different life transitions.
- Major components include: Transition Planning, K-12 Learning Journey, and the <u>Capstone</u>

 <u>Project.</u>

CAPSTONE PROJECT

- The Capstone is a culminating passion project, presentation, or performance that allows students the opportunity to consolidate and showcase the learning from their school and life experience into a meaningful and relevant product.
- It is a celebration of learning and experience, designed to encourage students to think critically, solve challenging problems and develop skill sets for life.


EXAMPLE

- Q How Can prosthetics be designed to function in a sport like soccer?
- Project: met with a physiotherapist and an amputee to talk about different types of prosthetics. Created a digital prototype and then built it. Journaled and photographed his progress.
- Representation: Sample of a real prosthetic as well as the one he made, videos and photos of his progress and his transition plan.






















CAPSTONE PROJECT

- Students will be required to seek out a mentor for the project.
- Mentors outside of immediate family must complete a Criminal Record Check before working one-on-one with a student.
- ► The Capstone Project, transition plan, and K-I2 Learning Journey will be presented at the end of the semester in an informal setting. The presentation itself will not be for marks, but is a mandatory part of the project.
- Tentatively the presentation will take place during the transition days at the end of the semester.

- 3. Essay: minimum 500 words describing and giving evidence you met the criteria of the award and why you would be suited candidate for nomination
