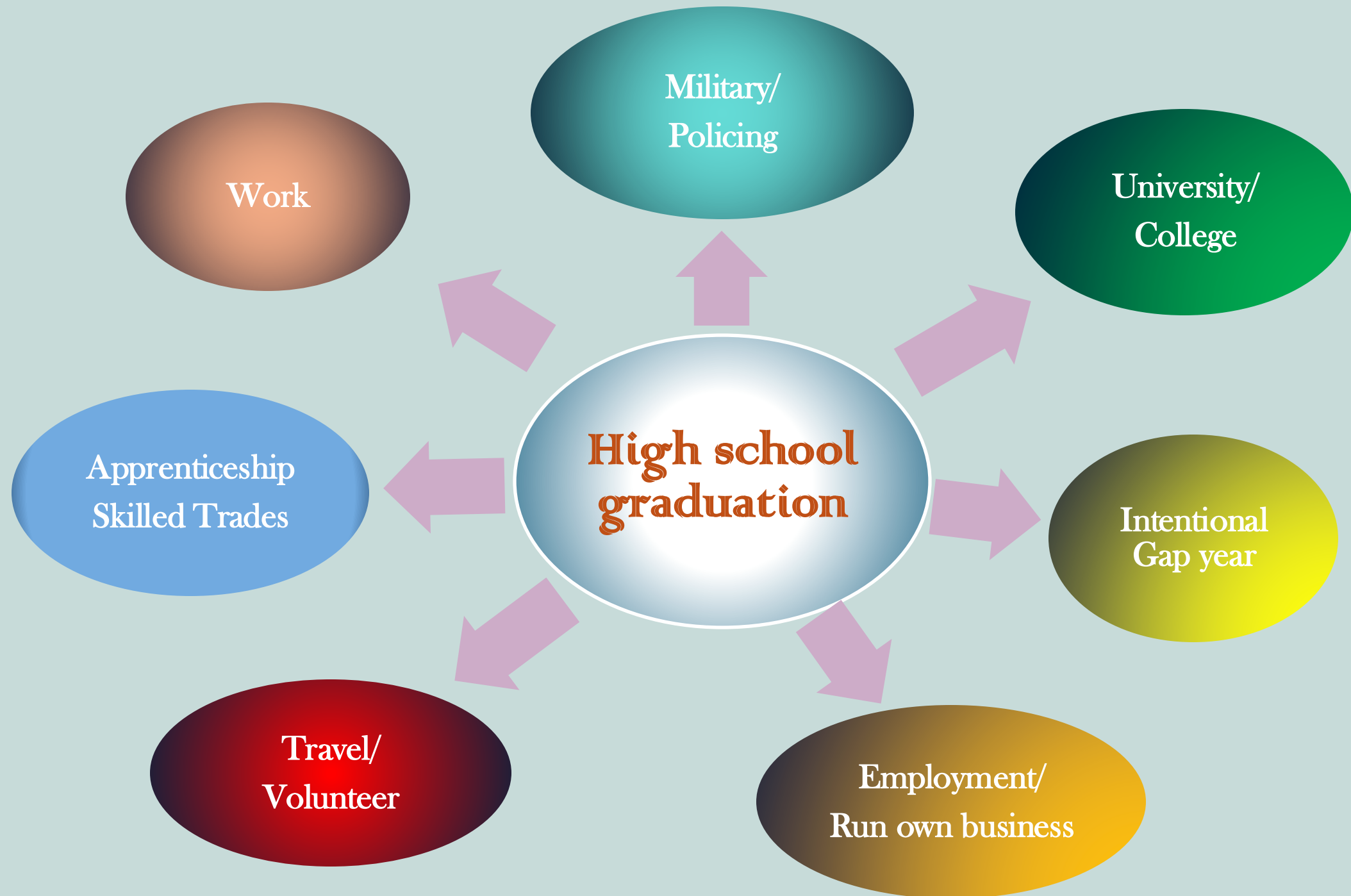

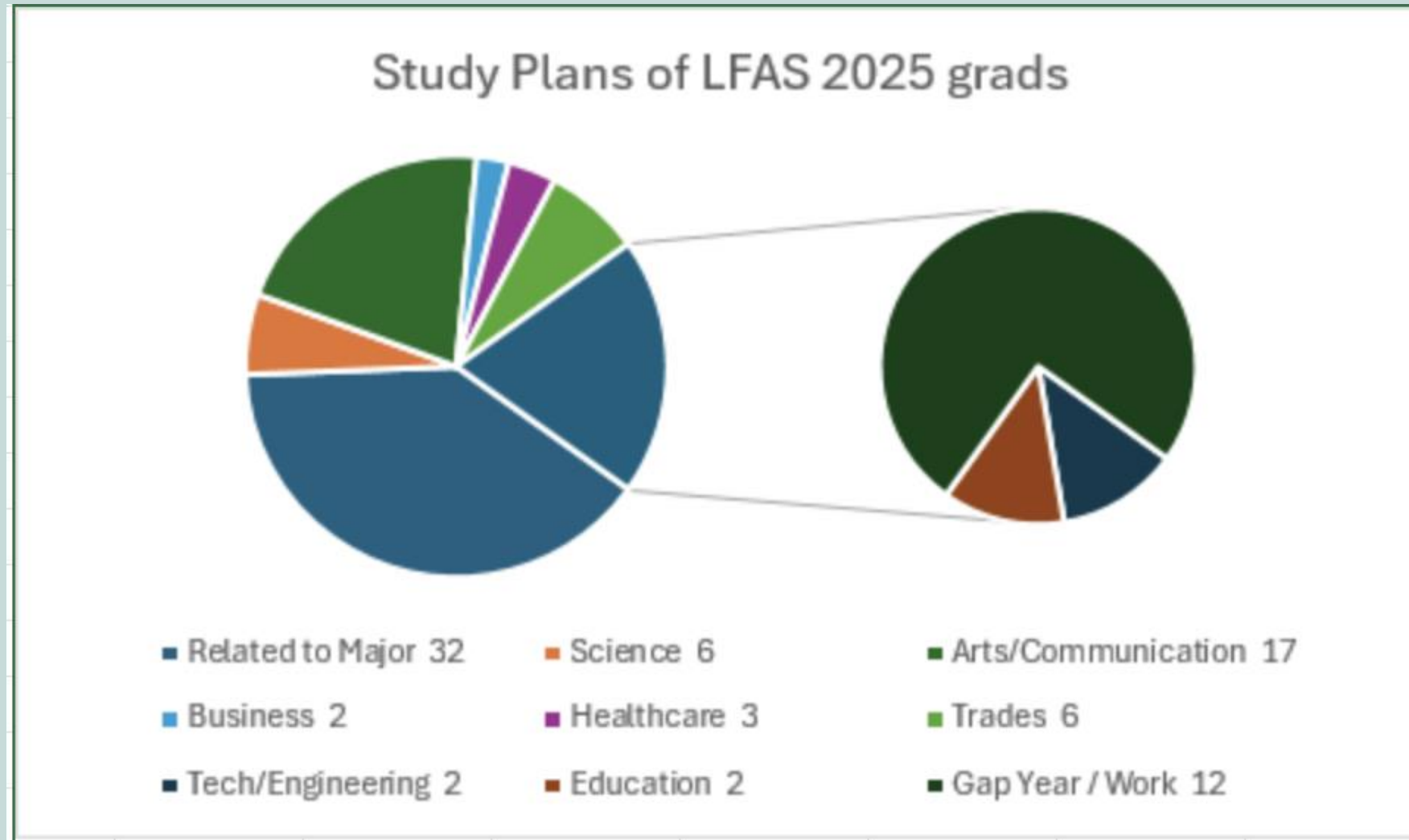
GRADUATE DEMOGRAPHICS

CLASS OF 2025 SURVEY



 - *Give them some information about yourself including transcript, future education plan, extra-curriculum activities, achievements, etc.*
 - *Request the letters 2-3 weeks before deadline.*
 - Scholarship Handbook and Document Checklist on District Website
