The Langley School District (SD35) offers the SkilledTradesBC Youth Train in Trades Hairstylist program at Aldergrove Community Secondary School (ACSS). This full-time program provides SD35 students the opportunity to participate in SkilledTradesBC recognized Foundation Technical Training (includes Level 1). Students earn high school course credits, as well as post-secondary credits, while learning the required skills and knowledge to become an apprentice upon program completion.

# Tuition, Program Fees and Credentials Earned

Youth Train in Trades programs are only offered to registered \$D35 students. At the time of application students must:

- Be registered and currently attending a school in the Langley School District
- Be 18 or younger on June 30 of application year
- Have intention to graduate

## **Prerequisites**

Have completed before the start of the program:

- Grade 10
- English 11

#### Recommended:

• Personal service experience, salon, spa etc.

# **Tuition and Program Fees**

- Tuition is paid by the Langley School District. Value of approximately \$7500
- Student pays approximately \$1750 for hair kit, textbooks and supplies (kept by the student after the program)
- Partial bursary available for students requiring financial assistance
- Some additional costs may be incurred (footwear/ PPE)
