To remain eligible to participate students must keep their application valid by being registered in a Langley District school for the first semester, taking at least 3 courses.

- Learn the art and business of hairstyling in a full-service training salon
- Use advanced salon techniques to provide a full range of hair services
- Create artistic designs using the latest technology, trends and brand name products

Prerequisites

- Registered in at least 3 courses within the Langley School District at the time of application
- Completed grade 10
- Completed English 11
- Fully proficient in the English language
- Minimum of 15 years of age and must complete the program before 20 years of age
- Intention to graduate with a Dogwood Diploma

Keys to Success

- Regular attendance and a solid commitment to the program for both modules (Semester I & II)
- Passion to explore the hair industry
- Willingness to learn through feedback and self-reflection in a supportive environment
- Enthusiasm and motivation to work within a team
- Sensitivity, respect, and strong desire to work with clients on a personal level
- Good hand-eye coordination, depth perception and ability to stand for long periods of time
- High tolerance to hair care products and/or odors

Program Fees

Approximately **\$1,650** includes: professional toolkit, equipment, supplies and textbooks. These tools of the trade are kept by students for future use.

Program Savings

Tuition for Hairstylist training programs in British Columbia ranges from \$7,000 to \$26,000 depending on the training institution.

How to apply:

- See your school's Career Advisor
- Complete an application in full and return by the deadline
- Interviews will be held in April/May
- Students will be advised of their acceptance status by late May, in time to register at ACSS for the following school year

Future steps to become a certified RED SEAL Hairstylist

- Completion of Level 2
- Accumulation of a total of 3,600 work-based training hours
- ITA Standardized Written Exam
- Interprovincial Red Seal Exam

Year 1 Semester 1

- · September January
- At home school or ACSS (Taking: English 11, Social Studes 11 or equivalent, a Math 11 course, a Science 11 course)

Year 1 Semester 2

- February June
- · Hairstylist Semester at ACSS earning 20 elective credits
- Students may start practicum

Summer Work

- · Can be paid or unpaid
- · Hours logged as part of a 300 hour work practicum

Year 2 Seme<u>ster 1</u>

- · September January
- Hairstylist Semester at ACSS earning 20 elective credits

Year 2 Semester 2

- · February June
- Direct entry to work if graduated or Semester 2 at home high school, ACSS or any other semestered school taking English 12 and completing academic requirements to graduate
