## **Program Prerequisites**

## Tuition, Program Fees and Credentials Earned

Dual Credit programs are only offered to registered SD35 students. At the time of application students must:

- Be registered and currently attending a school in the Langley School District
- Be 18 or younger on June 30 of application year
- Have not graduated from high school before starting the program
- Be on track to graduate

### **Prerequisites**

Have completed before the start of the program:

- Grade 11
- English 11

#### Recommended:

- B or higher in English 10 and Math 10
- Strong interest in pursuing a career in health science or nursing.

### **Tuition and Program Fees**

- Tuition is paid by the Langley School District (value of approximately \$1000)
- Student pays approximately \$250 for textbook

#### **Credits and Credentials Earned**

- Credit for 1 post-secondary course (3 credits)
- Credit for 1 high school course (4 credits)
