Canada Housing Benefit

Please add the item below to an upcoming newsletter to ensure parents are aware of the NEW/ONE TIME benefit from the Government of Canada; please ensure that your Enhanced Support Team is aware, as well:

The application portal for the one-time top-up to the Canada Housing Benefit is now open!

The Government of Canada has introduced a new affordability measure to help lower-income renters who are most affected by the rise of inflation and struggling with the cost of rent. The one-time top-up to the Canada Housing Benefit provides eligible applicants with a one-time payment of \$500. It is estimated that roughly 1.8 million lower-income renters will be able to benefit from this targeted investment.

How to Apply

Applicants will be able to apply for the one-time top-up to the Canada Housing Benefit on December 12, 2022, up until March 31, 2023, and are encouraged to apply online through **CRA My Account**, which is the quickest, easiest and most secure way to apply for the benefit. If you don't have a CRA My Account, register now. You do not need to wait for your security code in the mail. You can still access limited services in My Account to apply for this benefit immediately. Applicants can also sign in to their **My Service Canada Account** to securely access CRA's My Account without having to sign in again or revalidate their identity.

A <u>web form</u> will also be available to submit applications without having to sign in to My Account or My Service Canada Account. Address and direct deposit changes will not be permitted using the web form – if applicants haven't updated their personal and banking information, they should apply through the CRA My Account.

Applicants unable to apply for the benefit online, can call us at 1-800-282-8079 to complete their application with an agent. If you apply through My Account or by phone, and are signed up for <u>direct deposit</u>, you can get your payment within five business days.



National Braille Literacy Month is celebrated in January every year. It is also a celebration of the founder, Louis Braille's birthday. Apart from honoring Braille's legacy, this month aims to educate people about the importance and advantages of Braille literacy. The Braille system came as an advantage to people who suffer from different vision problems. The system remains unchanged to date. Now that Braille has been incorporated into digital devices and computers, it has become more accessible and relevant to the present technology-driven world.

Braille Basics

Braille is a system that enables blind and visually impaired people to read and write through touch. It was devised by Louis Braille in 1821 and consists of raised dots arranged in "cells." A cell is made up of six dots that fit under the fingertips, arranged in two columns of three dots each. Each cell represents a letter, a word, a combination of letters, a numeral or a punctuation mark.

The Braille Cell

The first ten letters of the alphabet are formed using the top four dots (1, 2, 4, 5). Adding a dot 3 makes the next ten letters, and adding a dot 6 to that makes the last six letters (except "w" because it was not used very much in the French language at the time that Louis Braille devised this system). Punctuation is represented by its own unique set of dots, most often found in the lower part of the cell. In addition to the alphabet, the Braille Code includes many contractions, which are braille cells that can stand for a combination of letters or entire words. Literary braille numbers are formed by placing the braille number sign \vdots (dots 3, 4, 5, and 6) before the braille letters "a" (\vdots :). There is also a code used for math and science notations called Nemeth.






Dry Grad


