GROUNDS WORK / CONSTRUCTION

Maintenance has begun doing some work on the school grounds and will be continuing over the next few weeks. In order to do that they need to create access to the area for trucks. That required removing the small playground area with the spinning donut and the small dome climber. If there is room for one or both of these, we will put them back in.

- They are preparing the east wing swing area for an accessible swing. This will include removing pea gravel and putting in wood chips.
- They are working to improve drainage at the bottom of the hill from the east wing exit through to the primary gaga ball. They have dug a deeper trench, put in drainage pipe and covered it with gravel designed for drainage as well. The pavement in that area will be coming out and be redone to make sure that it slopes down gently to the drains. There will be a later phase done near the primary playground around Spring Break.
- They have also fixed one trench near the playground that has emerged on the Gr. 4/5 field. There are not further plans for the Gr. 4/5 field at this point, but we are working with the district on this question as well. To help students avoid the mud on the Gr. 4/5 field, we are allowing the Gr. 4/5 students to place soccer on the Gr. 6/7 fields over the winter.

THE MIDDLE YEARS DEVELOPMENT INSTRUMENT (MDI)

The Langley School District has partnered with the Human Early Learning Partnership (HELP) at the University of British Columbia to measure and promote children's social and emotional development, health, well-being, and assets through the Middle Years Development Instrument (MDI). The Middle Years Development Instrument (MDI) is a self-report questionnaire that asks children in middle childhood about their thoughts, feelings and experiences. The MDI is the first survey of its kind to gather information about the lives of children both in school, in the home and in the community, from their own perspective. The survey questions align with the BC Ministry of Education's K-12 curriculum, which includes a focus on promoting children's personal and social competencies. Grade 5, 6 & 8 students are invited to complete the MDI during class time between: January 14th and March 14th, 2025.




