#### • Special Presentations

- Revenue Generation Marcello Moino, Assistant Superintendent
  - > 8% of District Budgets are from non-staffing
  - Including portables and furniture for new divisions and new technology, supplies budgets have remained static
  - Are there alternate ways to create revenue for schools that allow programs to maintain diversity of experience, opportunity, and excellence?
  - ➤ \*AP525 Revenue Generation Adopted in 1997, revisions 2020
  - \*AP526 Public Gifts Adopted in 1979, revisions in 1983 and 2020
  - Research from other districts that have revised their policies
    - 1. AP 515 Commercial Advertising and the Solicitation of Funds in ABBOTSFORD is a sample
    - 2. Surrey Policy 10800
    - 3. Maple Ridge Policy 4110 Revenue Generation
    - 4. Coquitlam AP196 Corporate Sponsorships
  - ➤ Langley's AP language 25 Years old
  - ➤ Other Districts Language seems to be from 10 Years old
  - ➤ To Review and update language to allow for greater opportunities for revenue generation in line with neighboring District's and in line with the Districts Mission and Core Values

Comment: A parent does not have a problem with the local community companies helping schools and funding

  - 2. Provide critical incident and trauma recovery support to school districts and independent schools
  - 3. Deliver child and youth mental health and substance use supports
  - 4. Support students of all sexual orientations and gender identities (SOGI)
    - ➤ Part of the Mental Health in schools Strategy
    - > Assists in provision strategies on recent trends
    - > Gangs and Exploitation
    - ➤ Social Media/Digital Trends/Increase/Decrease in mental concerns
    - Erase Violence and Erase Cyberbullying are the most common in our Langley Schools
    - Erase Report it tool; Posters provided to every school

- A: Answers are not available currently until the government, give more funding
- Q: What is the accumulated surplus accounted for in major capital?
- A: Land purchases are concerned revenue that show up in the surplus, others are rainy day fund 1.5-3%
- Q: Do you see a downturn in secondary international students if adult students visa re being restricted as students will turn to other plans to get their education easier?
- A: Most want to go to WGSS and REMSS and there is no room. Looking for more foster families in other catchments.
