Dear LFAS Families,

Below is some information in regards to how we address communication when there are safety incidents or students in distress. This information has previously been shared, but we thought it would be a good reminder as we move into this next semester.

Student in Distress and School Safety

Health and safety are a priority in the Langley School District. Our schools follow procedures to help keep students, staff, and the community safe. Depending on the situation, communication to parents/caregivers is needed to keep families informed about incidents in our school, such as during lockdowns, hold & secures, and room clears, or in the event of a student in distress. Sometimes these incidents may not be emergencies but events that require a school response. It is important to note that the decision to send communications to families is dependent on a variety of factors including the nature of what happened, who has witnessed or was directly impacted by what happened, as well as student and staff privacy. Communication is unique and dependent on the specific situation; there are times when a student is in distress, yet the situation may or may not require a message or letter to families. In addition to communication to parents/caregivers, teachers and staff may debrief with students after an incident that may have upset them. In some cases, the school counsellor may offer support to students in need. As always, we want families to let us know if your child requires support. If you have any questions or concerns about communication related to situations or emergencies, please reach out to the school.





Health, safety, and wellness continue to be a priority in our schools. To help support our students and families, we are sharing important information from our community partner Fraser Health about Child and Youth Mental Health. Please see below for helpful reminders to support your child.

Support Your Child's Mental Health

Positive mental health allows us to enjoy our lives and can help children and youth weather the normal ups and downs of life. It plays a critical role in the healthy development of children and youth, supporting their ability to build healthy relationships and succeed in school.

How Can Parents Support Positive Mental Health?

Parents can foster positive mental health through strong and caring relationships with their children.

- Self-care – focus on doing something for yourself, even if just for a few minutes.
- Build routines – consistent schedules, such as meal, sleep and play times help children feel safe.
- Connect – talk and listen to their feelings and experiences.
- Be active together – take a walk and build physical activity into family time.
- Take notice – encourage and praise the positive behaviours and choices your children make.
- Keep learning – encourage your child to learn from both positive and negative experiences.
- Be present, not perfect – give your time, your encouragement and your presence.

Dance:

The dance program at Langley Fine Arts is designed to “refine, challenge and expand” students’ technical and creative potential by fostering a creative, inclusive learning environment. The program focuses on technique, composition, choreography and performance, and students also learn the science behind dance and movement – including anatomy, nutrition, and injury prevention.

Drama:

In the school’s drama program, students learn to work collaboratively in groups while stretching the limits of their imagination. Students will learn traditional styles of acting and theatre work, while also developing their own projects. Whether it’s creating and starring in a one-act play, learning to direct with an eye toward the film or television industry, or working behind the scenes in theatre tech, Langley Fine Arts’ drama major leaves students with useful skills that will benefit them, whether or not they choose a future in the theatrical arts.

Music:

Students in the music major program learn technical and musical skills on their chosen instrument (or voice) through solo work and collaborative ensemble performances. Students study music theory, ear training and keyboard, as well as exploring music from different historic and contemporary periods.

Visual Arts:

Students enrolled as Visual Arts majors will experience and learn from a wide variety of techniques, styles, and processes, from the traditional to the experimental. Students will have the opportunity to develop skills in drawing, painting, printmaking, mixed-media, sculpture and textiles, while art history is also integrated into the curriculum. At the Grades 11 and 12 level, students interested in post-secondary opportunities in everything from architecture, animation and various design fields are encouraged to enroll.

Photography:

Langley Fine Arts' Photography program takes a “fine arts” approach to the medium, as students are encouraged to develop their skills behind the camera by exploring and capturing the world around them. Students are expected to be curious, experiment, and challenge themselves, while also working together to improve their craft.
