This is especially critical in our community, as missing even short periods of time in arts classes can result in lost creative momentum, missed group work, and reduced opportunities for artistic growth. We kindly ask for your support in ensuring students arrive on time and stay for the full day whenever possible. Your efforts make a meaningful difference in helping students thrive academically, artistically, and socially.

Student in Distress and School Safety

Health and safety are a priority in the Langley School District. Our schools follow procedures to help keep students, staff, and the community safe. Depending on the situation, communication to parents/caregivers is needed to keep families informed about incidents in our school, such as during lockdowns, hold & secures, and room clears, or in the event of a student in distress. Sometimes these situations may not be emergencies but events that require a school response. It is important to note that the decision to send communications to families is dependent on a variety of factors including the nature of what happened, who has witnessed or was directly impacted by what happened, as well as student and staff privacy. Communication is unique and dependent on the specific situation; there are times when a student is in distress, yet the situation may or may not require a message or letter to families. In addition to communication with parents/caregivers, teachers and staff may debrief with students after an incident that may have upset them. In some cases, the school counsellor may offer support to students in need. As always, we want families to let us know if your child requires support. If you have any questions or concerns about communication related to situations or emergencies, please reach out to the school.

Current families of LFAS with a child entering Kindergarten still need to register and apply as per the below.


PROGRAMS OF CHOICE – DEADLINE TO REGISTER IS MONDAY, OCTOBER 20th

- 1. Go to our school appointments web site: https://lfas.schoolappointments.com
- 2. Register for an account by clicking the "**REGISTER**" menu tab and filling in the on-line form. Choose a user id and password for yourself and then click the "**Register Now**" button.
- 3. Add your children into the system by clicking the "Add a Student" button. Click "Insert New" button to add more children.
- 4. Click the "date" icon beside each child's name to schedule appointments. Select the staff you wish to book appointments with and the "View Calendars" button. Use the "Ctrl" or "Command" key to select multiple staff to view at the same time.
- 5. Click on available time slots to book your appointments and then click the "**Book Appointments**" button to save your bookings.

KEEP YOUR CHILDREN FREE FROM RESPIRATORY ILLNESSES THIS WINTER

As the weather gets colder and we spend more time indoors, we're more likely to get sick with things like colds, flu or COVID-19 because these illnesses spread more easily in enclosed spaces.

Everyone should take these steps to protect themselves and limit the spread of respiratory illnesses:

- Get vaccinated for flu and COVID-19 if you are eligible.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water. Use alcohol-based sanitizer if soap and water is not available.
- Avoid touching your face, especially your eyes, mouth and nose.
- Cough and sneeze into your elbow.
- If you have flu-like symptoms, stay home and away from people at higher risk of serious illness. If you are sick and cannot stay
 away from others, wear a mask. Learn more about masks here.

Vaccinations for respiratory illness

Vaccinations prepare our immune system to recognize and respond to viruses. When children get immunized, they are less likely to get sick or pass along illness to others and better able to focus on learning, playing and doing the activities they love.

Register your children with the Get Vaccinated system so you can be reminded to get flu or COVID-19 vaccinations when they are due. Seasonal respiratory vaccinations are available from pharmacies, public health units and some primary care providers.

School-aged immunizations

As children get older, the protection from some <u>infant immunizations</u> can wear off. To set young people up for long-term health and well-being, vaccines are offered routinely in kindergarten, grade 6 and grade 9 with catch-up opportunities in other grades. Getting your child vaccinated on schedule is one of the best ways to protect their health.

All routine school-aged immunizations are free in British Columbia. If your child is not up-to-date with their vaccines, please make an appointment with a public health unit, family doctor, nurse practitioner or pharmacy. If your child's record shows their vaccines are not current, but they did get vaccines from a health care provider outside of public health:

- Contact the health care provider who immunized your child and ask for a copy of the immunization record.
- Report these immunizations to Public Health online at: http://www.fraserhealth.ca/immunizationform

Homework Club

Why?

Provide a space for students to get extra support and time to complete missed work. This will be open for all students, but can be assigned as a support for students who are struggling to meet academic expectations.

When/Where?

Days	Tuesdays & Friday in Library 11:30am-12:10pm.	
Key Information	Supervised by admin, teachers/support staff can support if needed. Students who are assigned to HC will sign in with Admin. Others who come for support will not be required to sign in.	
Expectations	Students will attend the entire time. No ins and outs. Students will arrive with all required materials. Library expectations are in place around food and personal technology.	
Staff	Administration will be present to support. Teachers may volunteer their time if they are able.	

Teachers and Admin may assign students to homework club. Admin will communicate with parents when students are assigned and followed up will occur if student doesn't attend

Desired Outcomes



Student accountability: providing a proactive way to support students who are falling behind in academic expectations and/or been truant to classes.



Academic support: Students can access support for any of their classes and provide time to prepare for upcoming assessments/assignments.

Library Corner

OVERDUE, LOST, & DAMAGED BOOK INFORMATION

Just a quick note that we are about to turn on *automatic overdue notifications*. What this means is that parents / guardians of all K-6 students will receive an email if their child has an overdue book. All Grade 7-12 students will have overdue notifications emailed directly to their school email address.

What do I do if a book is lost or damaged?

It happens to us all! However, we will need to replace the book. There are two options: 1) email dstokesbennett@sd35.bc.ca and ask me to put the replacement cost on your School Cash Online account so you can pay it directly or 2) purchase the book yourself and drop it off at the library. If, for any reason, replacing a book is not financially viable for your family at this time, please contact Adam Moore at amoore@sd35.bc.ca to access school supports.

What if my Grade 7-12 student doesn't check their email?

Please encourage your children to monitor their school email accounts. Students can find their email address and reset their password (if necessary) through the below site:



Dear Friends of PA-MOJA,

We are excited to share some updates from another impactful year of our partnership with OI Pejeta Conservancy in Kenya. From supporting new and continuing scholarship students, launching an expanded day school program, traveling to Kenya this summer to connect with students, families, and communities—we have seen firsthand how your support is having a positive impact on people's lives. This newsletter highlights the progress that is made possible through your encouragement and generosity.

Scholarship Students

For the past 19 years, PA-MOJA has partnered with OI Pejeta Conservancy (OPC) in Kenya to support conservation through education. In that time, PA-MOJA has become OPC's largest donor for education. Since the program began, our emphasis has been to fund boarding school scholarships that cost about \$1,000 per year. To date, we have supported 260 students (51 current + 209 graduates). While most students received four full years of high school scholarships, others received more or less depending on when they joined the program. In total, that's 977 years of education funded — each year representing a young person given the opportunity to learn, grow, and create a brighter future for themselves and their communities. In 2024, we launched a program to support 78 day school students each year. Unlike our boarding school students, these young people live at home while attending local schools in the communities surrounding the conservancy. At just \$120 per year, these scholarships made a meaningful impact on families and were so successful in their first year that OPC asked us to continue the program. Scholarships are awarded annually to the top-performing students at local day schools, ensuring both opportunity and motivation for learners.

Summer 2025 Trip to Kenya

In July 2025, a team of fourteen people travelled to Kenya to meet OI Pejeta staff, scholarship students, families, and schools, and to experience the conservancy and its wildlife. Four PA-MOJA board members were joined by ten family and friends of



former board member Leigh Vierstra. Leigh, who passed away in September 2024 from complications of ALS, had been deeply committed to PA-MOJA. Her loved ones came to see the place she cared for so passionately and to witness firsthand the impact that PA-MOJA is having on the communities and the conservancy.

During the trip, PA-MOJA hosted our annual Scholarship Day, bringing students together for mentorship, discussion groups, and motivational talks from graduates. Students shared their successes, challenges, and ideas for improving the program, which PA-MOJA and OPC staff are now using to strengthen future support. The event also featured presentations from Kenyan students who



participated in the Butterfly Effect program this year. We were all very impressed by their work throughout the year and the quality of their presentations. This was the first time any had done online research or had presented in front of a big group of people. Learn more about Butterfly Effect here: https://pa-moja.com/butterfly-effect/.

In addition to time at OPC, we visited students in their schools, met parents, and were welcomed into homes. These visits are an important part of our work, allowing us to truly know our students and their communities. Students spoke openly about their experiences and expressed gratitude for PA-MOJA scholarships, while parents shared their pride and appreciation. With many families earning as little as \$5 a day, the support of scholarships not only opens doors to education but also strengthens families and local communities.

Throughout our entire trip, we were fortunate to see the incredible wildlife of the conservancy. These moments reinforced our belief that investing in students and



communities ultimately helps protect the wildlife of this remarkable place.
