Principal / Administration reports

Principal's Report – Mr. Wejr

- Thank you for the fun fair and all the volunteers who helped make it happen. It was an awesome event!
- Bike to school week: About 25% (~100) students rolled to school today!
- Regional track meet tomorrow at McLeod Athletic Park. About 60 students will represent our school. We've been working on fundamental movement skills and getting more students playing community sports and it shows.
- Grade 5 students have started their transition to Betty Gilbert Middle School. The Principal and Vice-Principal of BGMS came to Shortreed to speak to grade 5's, who will also get to go to BGMS for an upcoming visit.
- Welcome to Kindergarten event was a success. Over 70 registered K's and no room to grow, so we cannot accept Abbotsford registrants. 3 portables will be staying where they are. ELL will have to move as we are losing this portable. Overall enrollment is down but through the summer we expect to get to usual numbers.
- Mrs. Graham is overseeing the Talent Show, taking place June 9th. In person and video entries.
- Sports day: To answer previous question, we will come in and eat lunch first, and then students will go out to play.

- June 21st is National Indigenous Peoples' Day; there will be a focus on celebration and students will do a gallery walk through the school. Grade 5s will drum for a school gathering.
- June is also Pride month; we will celebrate with a Diversity Day on June 23rd where the focus is "Proud to be me".
- School calendar: Next year there will be one day off for Student Inclusive Conferences, plus one day with a 2 hour dismissal (instead of two x 1 hour dismissals) and one evening conference night.

- Last DPAC general meeting was held this month. Executive meeting is planned for June 1st.
- Trustee Neufeld shares the District is struggling to keep up with School Counsellors (having enough of them). Provincially, funding is for 1 Counsellor per 589 students. Trustees are trying to bring this up to the Province, to reduce the ratio so more counsellors are available to students.

Members at Large – Allie Brush, Cashmere Roder (Nicole Chadwick absent) Cashmere:

- Funfair: Approximately \$4400 in profit. Presales approximately 200 wristbands; now depleted wristband stock. Great turnout. More adult volunteers would help. Discussion around incentives for parents who volunteer to encourage more volunteers. Thank you to all volunteers who did help!! Noted long lineups for rock wall and swing rides; may try to get another attraction from BC Events to help with that next year (Elementary students weren't able to do "expert" side of rock wall so maybe an easier option?). Some feedback / requests for more sports type of games (ie Radar guns for soccer kicks, basketball shots or?). Any feedback or suggestions are welcome! Cashmere is also looking for someone to shadow her role in organizing the funfair, to take on the position in the future.
- Spring Dollar Sale April 21st: Great turnout. Just under \$2000 profit. Next one planned for November.

Shelter Committee - Amy, Jen, Jodi, Nicole, Laura & Mrs. Tarasoff

 Parent Jared Wheway followed up with his employer, Alliance Concrete Pumps, who have put approximately \$20,000 aside to donate towards outdoor shelter. Option to work with them to build it or purchase through another company. Committee needs to meet to discuss plans. Mrs.
 Tarasoff will get back to the committee with possible June meeting dates.

Old Business:

- Gym sound system update:
 - o Mr. Wejr District staff attended and recommended not having 4 speakers as currently set up, but two large speakers where the screen is. Quote: Blue tooth receiver (stereo) is \$3225.35, and the speakers are \$4220.78. This includes \$1800 labour and taxes. Motion by Laura Wheway to increase budget by \$2500 (to \$7500) to pay for new stereo and the speakers, as recommended; Second by Amy Synesael. All in favor. Mr. Wejr will purchase the sound system and PAC will reimburse.
- ER Supplies Previous request from Mrs. Tarasoff to purchase 6 additional privacy tents. Parent Darren Pritchard provided quote from his employer for 4 additional stand-up tents and portable toilets; tents are \$104 each and toilets are \$120. Concerns regarding fabric floor in tents if they are to be used for bathrooms. Current emergency buckets are easier to store and don't require same chemical treatments as the portable toilets offered. Plan to look further into floorless tents.
- Scholarships: 6 applications received for Shortreed PAC Scholarship (\$500 bursary) and posted on school Web site for voting. Winning essay:
 Congratulations Avery! Laura Wheway and Stephanie Wakeling will be attending

the luncheon on June 7th on behalf of Shortreed PAC to present Avery with the bursary.
