# WHAT IS MONTESSORI?

Montessori is a method of education based on a self-directed, hands-on, "learning through experience" approach to learning. It was developed by Dr. Maria Montessori, who was a three-time Nobel Peace Prize nominee born in Italy in 1870. Her educational method evolved over fifty years of work with children worldwide.

Dr. Montessori believed that a truly educated individual continues learning long after the years spent in the classroom because of an inner motivation, a natural curiosity, and a love of learning. The aim of a Montessori education is to provide a learning environment that contributes to the development of reflective individuals who are caring and ethical members of the community.

# KEY PRINCIPLES OF A MONTESSORI EDUCATION

- Individualized to meet the needs of the child
- "learning through experience"
- multi-age groupings which promote peer teaching and learning
- individual, small group, and large group lessons
- learning through multi-sensory experiences
- choices in learning such as where, when, who, and what to learn with or about
- The Great Lessons: "The Story of the Universe", "The Story of Life", "The Story of Math", and "The Story of Language".

# What will you see in your child's Montessori classroom?

### **STUDENTS**

Children, through individual choices, make use of what the environment has to offer to aid in their development.

- Kindergarten (only stand-alone grade)
- Multi-age groups in each class. Ideally, the classrooms are grades 1/2/3 and 4/5/6
- Remain with the same teacher for three years, (except for Kindergarten)
- Freedom to select work within a structured environment.

### **TEACHERS**

The child interacts with the teacher when support and/or guidance are needed.

- B.C. professional certified teachers
- Montessori trained or in training
- Follow Montessori and B.C. curriculum

### PREPARED ENVIRONMENT

The teacher prepares the environment to encourage independence, freedom within limits, and a sense of order.

- Full set of specially designed Montessori learning materials
- Balance between freedom and responsibility.
- Fosters independence
- Extended work cycles: unbroken work time to foster the child's concentration
- Work appropriate for each child
- Promotes respect of self, others, and the environment
