4. Principal's Report - Mr. Malo

- Halloween Carnival
 - o Funds Raised: \$1,057
 - Future Outlook: Potential to become a new tradition
 - Feedback: Positive response from participants
- Trunk or Treat Great success

 - o First open to Parent; Strong parent support
 - Feedback from group next year, provide more advance notice for parents

- Back Fence Question:
 - o Can be opened in the morning?
 - Currently difficult to open and close
 - Safety risk if left open
 - Incident last year: fence fell on kids
 - Possible solution: move bins, currently pick-up is when school is not in service. Mr. Malo look into

5. Inquiry – Extending "Classroom Fund" to Resource Department

- Request:

- Determined Process:

- o Review and approve requests in January PAC Meeting

6. Gaga Pit

- Coach Cliff's Proposal:
 - Cost: \$4,272 USD (exclusive of duty/taxes, includes 25% surtax on metal/steel products)
 - o Delivery: Direct to School District, within 5 days of purchase
 - Estimated Costs:
 - ~\$8,000 CAD pre-maintenance
 - ~\$2,000 CAD maintenance
 - Total ~10K CAD
 - Voted and Approved: Black Gaga Pit
- All in Recreation Inc (Ontario): Awaiting a quote
- Decision made to move forward with USA supplier and order

- Fundraising Efforts
 - o Attendance: ~400 kids
- Request for Sensory-Friendly Access
 - Proposal: Open 30–60 minutes early for children with sensory concerns (less busy environment).
 - Challenges:
 - No closed-off area to enforce.
 - Possible alternatives: allow entry during setup or towards the end.
 - o Consideration: Explore spreading out the event to reduce crowding.
