Introduction:

Principal's Report:

School Action Plan goals are the same as last year; to create 1) a unified culture of care and belonging, and 2) a strong culture of literacy

Goals aim to help students reach proficient reading levels through guided reading, literacy activities and learning assistance groups; also, to teach students strategies to identify and regulate their emotions

So far 503 appointments have been booked for student inclusive conferences. Students are looking forward to presenting to their parents during their conference.

Open Discussion:

S. Harrison went over some more details in regards to the FB group "Mom's Against Racism." The group offers assemblies at elementary schools that teach more about understanding diversity. The assemblies are usually about 30 min long and are \$250.00. PAC could look at adding an assembly during Respect and Diversity week in February. This can be discussed further at the next meeting. S. Harrison will look into available dates and age group for the assembly.

AOT (taekwondo): we can reach out to him to confirm dates for February.

Fundraising at our school has helped the PAC raise funds that provided our playground, buddy bench and so much more. With limited space left we should look into what our school needs. We will reach out to Swing Time (the company who we purchased our playground from) and see if we can add another play structure to the area near the tree stumps. We can look into adding benches around the school and getting a quote for installing a "friend's house" similar to the wooden structure that was built at Willoughby. It would be nice to provide some shade in the grass area. We can also reach out to local developers to see if they would be interested in building/donating their time to create a shaded space.
