


## **Celebrating Diwali**

Teacher Kam taught us about her family's Diwali traditions of turning on all the lights, lighting candles, eating special sweet treats, and giving gifts.


#### A Time to Remember



## Grade six and seven routine immunizations are starting soon at school

Public Health will soon be sending home an immunization consent package for grade six and seven students. It is important for students and their parents/guardians or representatives to review the consent package and talk about consent for routine child immunization, together.

Please note this update is about routine child immunizations and not COVID-19 vaccinations. COVID-19 vaccine is provided free to all eligible individuals at COVID-19 vaccination clinics in communities. Please ensure your student is vaccinated when they are eligible. For more information and to learn how to book a COVID-19 vaccination appointment please visit: <u>www.gov.bc.ca/VaxforBC.</u>

Your child can be safely immunized during COVID-19. School immunization clinics will be set up in a way to consider and respect others' personal space to maintain everyone's health and safety. If your child has COVID-19-like symptoms, they should not attend the school immunization clinic. To discuss re-scheduling your child's immunizations or for more information, please contact your local Public Health Unit, as listed below.

As part of the Vaccination Status Reporting Regulation and the school-based routine immunization program, Public Health:

- · Collects information for incomplete immunization records
- Checks immunization records for all students being offered immunizations in the school setting
- · Offers students all vaccines they need to be brought up-to date for their age
