1. Welcome – Jennifer Pyper

- Meeting called to order at 7:02pm
- New guest Rachel Bailey welcomed

2. Review & approve previous meeting minutes - Donna Doradea-Cabrera

- Correction noted to the spelling of Gillian's name in the September 26, 2022 minutes
- Motion to approve September 26, 2022 PAC Annual General Meeting minutes as presented
 - o Rachel Bailey motioned. Jennifer Pyper seconded. All in favour.

3. Principal's report – Stephanie Labby

- Student and family affordability fund video
 - Guidelines from the ministry
 - Help with back to school expenses
 - Meet the needs of vulnerable families and students
 - Assist with food security
 - Equity and local decision making
 - Langley's share of funds is \$2.1million to be spread across the Langley schools (expand meal programs, school supplies, additional fees connected to the school)
 - Cannot be used for salaries, admin costs, overhead costs
 - Cannot be used for past fee reimbursements
 - Guiding committee responsible for consulting and making final decisions
 - Consultation with PAC and DPAC, Local First Nations, Lower Fraser Valley Aboriginal Society, Wacaeya Metis Society, School district staff, Inclusion Langley, Langley School District Foundation
 - Funds distributed based on existing hardship policies (those students/families who are most vulnerable to food insecurity and low income)
 - All funds must be spent by June 30, 2023



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- Langley DRAFT plan
 - Identify families, through reliable data, who face food insecurities and low income
 - Identify additional students and families through consultation
 - Identify priority needs through Enhanced Support Teams (EST) and consultation
 - Disburse funds based on priority needs that meet the ministry criteria
- Provide feedback by end of October (which do you see as the highest priority food, supplies, fees)
 - Are there other sources to identify students and families that may be missing?
 - How do we ensure students and families who need support know how to connect with supports offered at the school?
 - Is anything missing?
- Further updates from Stephanie Labby
 - Requested to approach the school administration confidentially with missing groups
 - YCMS lump sum amount will be shared at a later date
 - ACTION Jennifer Pyper: Communicate through YCMS social media pages to connect with YCMS Principal and Vice Principal if experiencing hardship and financial aid is needed
- Boat build challenge completed across the school as part of Refuge read aloud program
- Staff are supporting the YCMS giving trees
- Grade 8 learning through MyBlueprint where students actively learn about their interests, skills, passions, feelings, and document what they discover about themselves in pictures, videos, and journals
- Local programs to help support those in need
 - o Groceries for the weekend, snacks from the fire department, coats & boots swap, counseling
 - Shopping through Glenwood Closet (go through the school to donate)
 - o ACTION Stephanie Labby: Confirm with Glenwood Closet any specific items they are needed
 - Jennifer Pyper noted that funding from Langley School District Foundation is going to school community backpack
- Screenagers version 2 being shown at the school on January 16
- Culture building opportunity at the school November 23 to view the Canada vs Belgium FIFA game
- Three band concerts planned for December 6 during the day; parents are welcome
- Report cards and IEP reports going home December 9
- December 12 is spirit week
- December 13 pancake breakfast and pajamas

4. Treasurer's Report – Jennifer Pyper

- Discussion
 - Fees applied to gaming account for baking club and web leader t-shits
 - o Gaming account balance \$20,000 (field trips, emergency supplies)
 - o General account balance \$74,000 general account (approximately \$60,000) after expenses

5. Fundraising Report – Kara Eastgate / Jennifer Pyper

- Fundraising profits
 - o \$181 Neufeld
 - o \$381.15 Purdy's
 - \$592.58 Fundscript gift cards (\$18,000 gift cards sold)
 - \$2,900 Halloween dance (minus expenses)
 - No spirit wear profit yet; waiting second batch of spirit wear
