### **HOMESTAY HOLIDAYS/COVERAGE**

- We are looking for homestay families who could accommodate for holiday coverage. Please email your respective Homestay Coordinators if you're available
- International students cannot be left unsupervised overnight
- If you are travelling without your student(s) there are two options available:

**Option 1.** Arrange for an adult age 25 or older, preferably a close friend or family member who already knows your student, to stay in your home and look after the student while you are away. This person must provide a current Police Record Check

**Option 2.** Your student may be looked after by another Langley School District Homestay family. You must inform your Homestay Coordinator of temporary homestay arrangements

#### THOUGHTFUL HOLIDAY GIFT IDEAS FOR YOUR STUDENT

- Communicate gift expectations: Let the students know what Christmas and gift-giving look like in your family and be specific about appropriate gift budgets.
- Personalize Your Gifts: Choose items that reflect your student's interests—consider books, favorite snacks, or hobby supplies
- Handwritten Notes/Greeting Cards: Add a heartfelt touch with a personal note or greeting card to show you care
- Consider Experiences: Gift vouchers for local attractions or activities, like Christmas markets, holiday lights, bowling, or movies, can create lasting memories together
- Send Photos! **ispphotos@sd35.bc.ca**: Capture special moments by taking photos at local markets and holiday events with your students
- Enjoy Holiday Treats Together: Share warm moments by visiting local bakeries, or making hot chocolate
- Be Their Family Here: Remember that your student may miss their family during the holidays. Your presence and support can be a meaningful gift in their time away from home.
