1. Welcome – Christos Gitersos

 Christos acknowledged the territories of the Kwantlen, Katzie, Semiahmoo and Matsqui First Nations.

4. Principal's Report – Mr. Bako

- School is growing even though we are short on room 577 students
- Field trips are happening again, with caveats (e.g., parent drivers rather than buses, limiting volunteers). These enrich the school experience.
- Meet the Teacher meetings went well, and parents made the 15 minute rotations work.

- This Friday is a provincial professional development day. Running workshops on math manipulatives, mind up (psychosocial) as well as online seminars including autism-related content.
- All schools are required to have an action plan. RCG's is tied in with literacy and socioemotional growth. Looking to tease these apart further. Internal debate on best
 processes, which is helpful. We look for consistency across grade levels, and are getting
 baseline on reading levels. We will look at student progress, and also at progress for
 Aboriginal learners and learners with special needs. We will also have a workshop on
 "En-souling Schools", which is on reconciliation.
- Slogan has been changed to be more usable: At RCG we show PRIDE by being kind, respectful, responsible and safe.
- Early dismissals this week we are stuck with these early dismissal days even though we are not using these dates for parent-teacher conferences. Working to take these early dismissal days out next time around. For this time, teachers have been asked to reach out to parents on individual needs/issues.
- From November 12 to December 3, Foundations Skills Assessment taking place for grade fours. It includes reading, writing and numeracy. It is a snapshot and there are limited exemptions (e.g., if a child has an IEP in a related subject or socio-emotional issue).
- Three bowl swings have been ordered at \$12,000. No pressure on PAC, but any contribution would be welcome. Kids need equipment to play on and hopefully they will last 10 to 15 years.
- Hallowe'en please no treats from home
- Have only had one notification to self-monitor, so that is good. Overall, school district has had low numbers so far. Forty-four schools and 23,000 students, so doing very well.
- Intramurals basketball happening three times per week, which is great to see.

- Kilometre Club west side is unpaved with hill and potholes. Would be good to complete that somehow. Track was meant to go around perimeter of field, but would be good to complete this. Mr. Bako can put this forward to maintenance to find out what this would entail. No idea what it would cost, but likely substantial.
- Question about tennis could happen depending on priorities for available funding.
