

## PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Hello ACSS students and families,

This week at ACSS our Recreation Leadership class, lead by Ms. Haber, organized daily events to honour the legacy of Terry Fox, and help raise funds for Terry's cause – the fight to end cancer. On Wednesday at lunch students and staff were entertained by Ms. Caines and Mr. Jones as they both agreed to part with some hair (Ms. Caines had her head shaved while Mr. Jones had his legs waxed!). In doing so, the school was able to raise \$1000 for Ms. Caines cause and \$50 for each strip of waxed hair removed from Mr. Jones (4 strips x \$50 = \$200). #### **School Appointments - Parent Instructions**

- 1. Go to School Appointments Aldergrove Community Secondary School
- Register for an account by clicking the "REGISTER" menu tab and filling in the on -line form. Choose a user id and password for yourself and then click the "Register Now" button.
- Add your children into the system by clicking the "Add a Student" button. Click
   "Insert New" button to add more children.
- 4. Click the "date" icon beside each child's name to schedule appointments.
- 5. Select the staff you wish to book appointments with. Use the "**Ctrl**" or "**Command**" key to select multiple staff to view at the same time.
- Select how your meetings will be held. The default is in person. You only need to do this if you want a phone or Teams meeting.

### **Important Dates**

- October 18th Dry Grad Meeting 7pm in the library. Come help coordinate your child's Dry Grad event and help organize fundraising initiatives to make the cost of Dry Grad accessible for all ACSS grade 12s!
- October 26th School Photo Retakes. Any students who missed their ID card photo day in September can sit for retakes. We encourage all grade 12s to sit for photos as these photos will be used for GoCards/Student ID, in MyEd (staff view) and in the Library system.






Election Day: Use of School Sites

On Saturday, October 15<sup>th</sup>, many school gyms across the District, specifically in the Township of Langley, will be used as local election polling stations from 8am to 8pm. As guided by Section 81 of the Election Act, "accommodation in a school that is the property of a board of school trustees under the School Act must be made available by the board for use as a voting place." No District sites in the City of Langley will be used on election day. Please take note of extra pedestrian and vehicle traffic in the area of these sites on election day. The District appreciates the support and cooperation from families and members of our community. The District is encouraging everyone who is eligible to do their civic duty and vote. #### COVID-19 Guidelines – September 2022

COVID-19 is still in our community. Our schools will continue to prioritize health and safety and follow protocols to prevent the spread of any communicable diseases. As always, we will be following the current COVID-19 guidelines in K-12 schools which are similar to how we ended the last school year. You can view the guidelines <u>here</u>. We are sharing important reminders for students, staff, and families, to help keep our school community safe:

- Stay home when sick
- Be aware of your health daily
- Practice proper handwashing hygiene
- Practice proper coughing and sneezing etiquette

Below is an excerpt from the guidelines on What To Do When Sick:

#### What To Do When Sick

Staff, students, or other persons who are exhibiting new symptoms of illness (including symptoms of COVID-19 or gastrointestinal illness) should stay home and follow the BCCDC guidance outlined below:

If the person is experiencing COVID-19 symptoms

#### **BCCDC** Guidance

The <u>When to Get Tested for COVID-19</u> resource or the <u>B.C. Self-Assessment Tool</u> provides more information on whether you should get a test for COVID-19. Those unsure or concerned about their symptoms should connect with a health care provider or call 8-1-1.

Staff, children, or other persons in the school setting who test positive for COVID-19 should follow the guidance on the <u>BCCDC website</u> as to how long they should self-isolate. They can return to school when they no longer need to self-isolate as long as symptoms have improved, and they are well enough to participate in regular activities. Schools should not require a health care provider note (e.g., a doctor's note) to confirm the health status of any individual, beyond those required to support medical accommodation as per usual practice.
