Why this Program?

About the Program

The Langley School District (SD35) offers the SkilledTradesBC Youth Train in Trades Piping/Plumbing program at Langley Secondary School (LSS). This full-time program, in partnership with British Columbia Institute of Technology (BCIT), offers SD35 students the opportunity to participate in SkilledTradesBC recognized Foundation Technical Training (includes Level 1). Students earn high school course credits, as well as post-secondary credits, while learning the required skills and knowledge to become an apprentice upon program completion.

Develop Professional Industry Skills

- Assemble, install and repair pipes, fittings and fixtures for water, drainage, gas and steam
- Design & troubleshoot complex piping systems for operation according to local building codes
- Work with Red Seal tradespeople in actual workplace environments

Program Prerequisites

Youth Train in Trades programs are only offered to registered SD35 students. At the time of application students must:

- Be registered and currently attending a school in the Langley School District
- Be 18 or younger on June 30 of application year
- Have not graduated from high school before starting the program
- Have intention to graduate

Prerequisites

Have completed before the start of the program:

- Grade 10
- English 11
- Any Math 11
- Any Science 11

Recommended:

- Experience in piping/plumbing

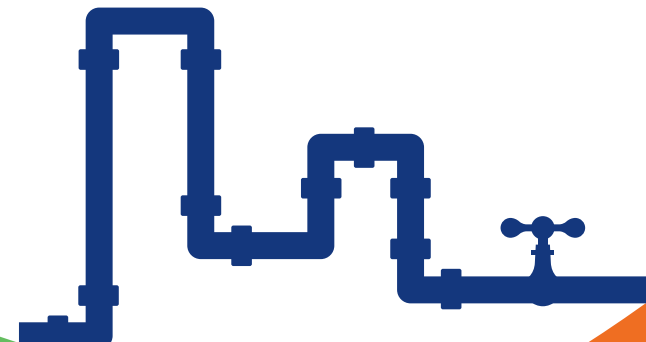
Tuition, Program Fees and Credentials Earned

Tuition and Program Fees

- Tuition is paid by the Langley School District. Value of approximately \$4300
- Student pays approximately \$1075 for tools, textbooks and supplies (kept by the student after the program)
- Partial bursary available for students requiring financial assistance
- Some additional costs may be incurred (footwear/ PPE)

Credits Earned

- SkilledTradesBC Piping Foundation (includes Level 1) Technical Training in: Plumbing, Sprinklerfitting and Steamfitting
- Credit for nine high school courses (36 credits)
