*Please note that course changes (for students who have a full timetable) will not be made during the first week of classes. A course change request form may either be downloaded from our school website or picked up in the main office. Students must attend their scheduled classes until they have a meeting with a counsellor.

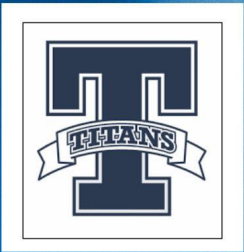

Student Fees

We continue to offer **School Cash Online**, which provides you with the convenience of paying online for the Student Activity Fee, Grad Ceremony Fee, Yearbook Orders and PAC donation. We are asking all LFMSS families to pay their school fees using our School Cash online system. Parents who are not able to pay online can pay at the office. **Please refer to the next page or our [school website](#) for School Cash Online payment instructions.**

Student Activity Fees 2026/2027 \$ 30.00 (Mandatory)

- The Student Activity Fee helps fund planned activities for LFMSS students such as guest speakers, school spirit days, special events, student agendas, & student leadership initiatives.

Yearbook 2026/2027 \$ 60.00 (Optional)

- Yearbooks are optional and can be ordered by prepayment online. Price increases to \$65.00 after October 31, 2026. Orders will be placed in early January 2027, so parents are encouraged to prepay to reserve your copy by early January 2027. Reminder to parents that student fees must be paid, and library materials returned to receive their yearbook at the end of the school year.

Grad Ceremony Fee 2026/2027 \$ 85.00

- The Grad Ceremony Fee includes Cap & Gown, Grad Class Photo & Folder and is payable by all Grads of 2027)

PAC Fundraising 2026/2027 \$ 50.00

- Our PAC promotes a \$ 50.00 donation and therefore limits year-long fundraising projects. This money goes into a PAC supervised account and is given back to the school in support of classroom instruction, student events, athletics, fine arts, and other electives. This payment can be made online using **School Cash Online** but if you are paying by cheque please make it payable to **LFMSS PAC** and drop it off at the office.

Counseling Center

Welcome to the Counseling Center. This includes Ms. Paula Frost for students with last names starting with A to L and Ms. Janelle Traber for students with last names starting with M to Z.

Counseling services include the following:

CAREER CENTRE

- Career Advisory Assistant available to meet individually with students.
- Advising students on career goals and assistance with establishing a plan.
- Checking for prerequisite courses and requirements for various occupations and post-secondary institutions.

EDUCATIONAL

- Course planning leading to graduation, post-secondary education and employment.
- Arranging for assistance for students academically.
- Providing scholarship information and applications.
- Helping students with the registration process for some post-secondary institutions.

PERSONAL

- Crisis counselling involving home or school issues and provide referrals to appropriate agencies.
- Resolution of problems arising from difficulties related to class or school policies and procedures.
- Students may drop in to see a counsellor during school hours and before or after school.
- Parents are also welcome to phone counsellors or book an appointment if they have any questions or concerns regarding their child.

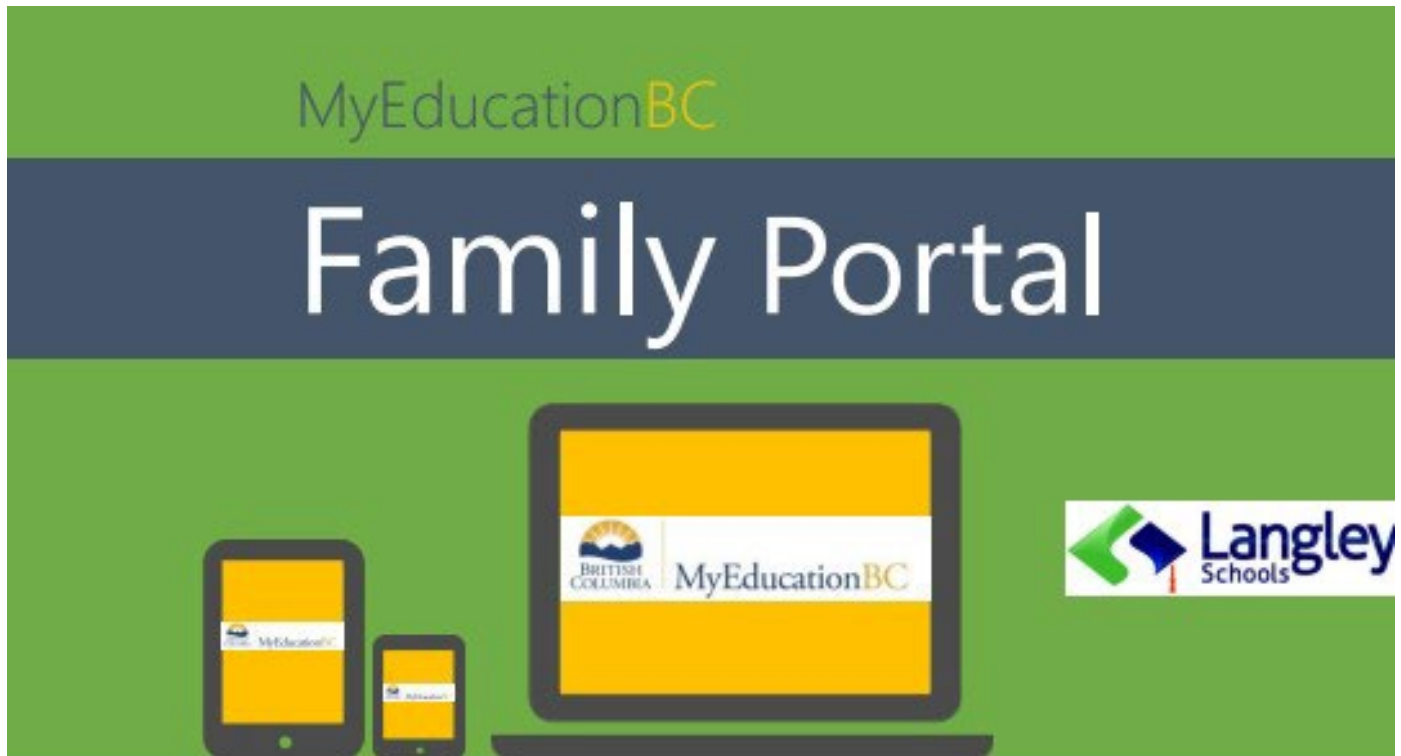

SchoolMessenger

The Langley School District uses a notification system called SchoolMessenger to communicate information to families. As we welcome our new families to our schools, some parents/guardians may receive a text message notifying them about SchoolMessenger. Below is information about the system.

Families may get a text message that says:

“Langley School District messages. Reply Y to confirm, HELP 4 info. Msg&data rates may apply. Msg freq varies. schoolmessenger.com/smsca”

What is SchoolMessenger:

- A notification service for parental outreach, emergency broadcasts, school information, student attendance alerts, secure file delivery, and other communications for education.
- A safe and secure service that enables schools to communicate in a timely matter, and ensure messages are received without delay or issues caused by email filtering or blocking.
- A service which makes use of recorded phone messages, emails, and text messages (optional to opt-in) to relay important information to students and parents/guardians.
- A service which makes use of contact information found on MyEDBC (provincial information system) to relay messages. (No action required to receive the service except for text message notifications requires parents/guardians to opt-in)
- A service that will NOT replace other communication methods. (e.g., parents/guardians can continue to access and connect with administrators via phone, email, and TEAMS meetings as usual).

What do families need to do in preparation for the new notification service?

- Read this information to get familiar with the service and know what to expect. An infographic about the tool is [here](#).
- Ensure your contact information on MyEDBC is up to date (email addresses and phone numbers). Please contact the school to make changes.
- If contact information is up to date, you will automatically receive phone and email messages.
- If you want to take advantage of the text message notification service (optional), please follow the instructions. If you have already opted-in by responding to an earlier text message sent by the District, no further action is needed. Instructions to opt-in are [here](#).
