Hello Titan Families!

We've made it through another week. By this time, students and staff have started to settle into their schedules and are establishing routines for the school year. Some key reminders that we want you to be aware for your family:

-Arriving on time is important; not only for learning but also to avoid disruptions to learning for all students in a classroom when a student (or multiple students) arrive late. Please work with your student and family to support on-time arrival. Early drop-off also helps avoid those traffic lines...!

-Students should be at school for the full day. Early dismissal should be for emergent issues only or unavoidable appointments that can not be scheduled outside of the school day. Again, leaving early impacts learning and disrupts the classroom.

-Our timetable is now set, and counsellors are no longer taking requests for course changes unless there is a circumstance related to post-secondary requirements or graduation requirements. There may be some adjustments for Semester 2 Timetables for Grade 11 or 12 students only.

-For our parking lots; we need your utmost patience and attention during those peak times. Our crossing guards have asked us to remind families not to stop in the crosswalks (wait until the area is clear) and to be following their directions. There are no perfect traffic patterns for schools, but your due diligence and understanding will help support the safety of everyone.

Thank you everyone for the warm welcome to the LFMSS Community! I am looking forward to all the great projects, events and learning we will be doing for the 2026-2027 school year.

Student Fees

We continue to offer **School Cash Online**, which provides you with the convenience of paying online for the Student Activity Fee, Grad Ceremony Fee, Yearbook Orders and PAC donation. We are asking all LFMSS families to pay their school fees using our School Cash online system. Parents who are not able to pay online can pay at the office. **Please refer to the next page or our [school website](#) for School Cash Online payment instructions.**

Student Activity Fees 2026/2027 \$ 30.00 (Mandatory)

- The Student Activity Fee helps fund planned activities for LFMSS students such as guest speakers, school spirit days, special events, student agendas, & student leadership initiatives.

Yearbook 2026/2027 \$ 60.00 (Optional)

- Yearbooks are optional and can be ordered by prepayment online. Price increases to \$65.00 after October 31, 2026. Orders will be placed in early January 2027, so parents are encouraged to prepay to reserve your copy by early January 2027. Reminder to parents that student fees must be paid, and library materials returned to receive their yearbook at the end of the school year.

Grad Ceremony Fee 2026/2027 \$ 85.00

- The Grad Ceremony Fee includes Cap & Gown, Grad Class Photo & Folder and is payable by all Grads of 2027)

PAC Fundraising 2026/2027 \$ 50.00

- Our PAC promotes a \$ 50.00 donation and therefore limits year-long fundraising projects. This money goes into a PAC supervised account and is given back to the school in support of classroom instruction, student events, athletics, fine arts, and other electives. This payment can be made online using **School Cash Online** but if you are paying by cheque please make it payable to **LFMSS PAC** and drop it off at the office.

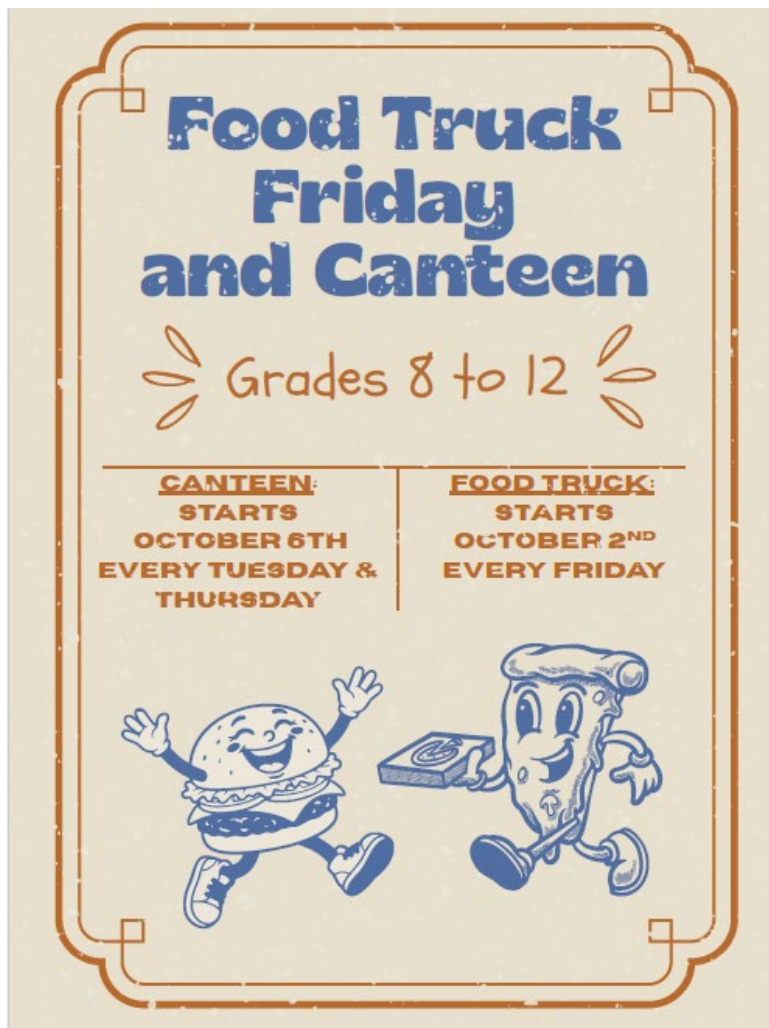

Tips for Parents for a Healthy Back to School Season

As children head back to school, parents face the familiar challenge of managing busy schedules, school routines and inevitably, health concerns.

Help set the stage for a healthy school year with Fraser Health's **Healthy Back to School Guide**.

The guide provides information on a variety of ways to keep children healthy during a school year. For instance, fostering healthy routines for sleep, mealtimes and physical activity can greatly support your child's health and wellness.

Staying healthy during the school year is also about protecting children from illnesses that can spread quickly in classrooms. It is important to make sure children wash their hands properly, and to keep them home if they are feeling unwell.

Another way to protect your child's health is to ensure their immunizations are up to date. Vaccines help prevent several serious illnesses and infectious diseases, for example, measles. Please check that you (if born in or after 1970) and your children have received at least two doses of a measles-containing vaccine. Find out how to check your immunization records [here](#).

Vaccines are available at many **pharmacy locations**, physician offices, and at all **public health units**.
