What is Youth Work in Trades?

A program that provides graduation credits to paid apprentices for completing work-based training hours.

Employer Benefits

- Earn tax credits of up to 20% of the apprentice's annual salary
- Train workers from the start of their careers
- Give back to and invest in the local community
- Help students learn a trade while they earn credits towards high school graduation

Employer Responsibilities

- Have a experienced supervising tradesperson oversee the apprentice
- Maintain active WorkSafe BC coverage for employees
- Understand the apprenticeship process
- Complete required documents
- Provide meaningful paid work experience
- Submit work-based training hours to SkilledTradesBC
