Prospective Employer Information

The Provincial and Federal governments provide income tax credits, grants, and other financial support for employers with registered apprentices.

Employer Benefits

- Get access to the next generation of workers
- Train workers from the start of their careers
- Give back to and invest in the local community
- Help students learn a trade while they earn credits towards high school graduation
- Work hours for students during regular school days (if student schedule allows)
- Earn tax credits of up to 20% of the apprentice's annual salary

Youth Work in Trades: Prospective Employer Information

What it is

A program that provides graduation credits to high school students for completing paid apprenticeship hours in SkilledTradesBC trades under the supervision of a certified tradesperson.

Student Benefits

Students can:

- Earn while they learn
- Get a head start on their careers while still attending secondary school
- Go to school part-time and work part-time while earning full-time school credits
- Have a smoother transition from school to work
- Earn graduation credits for completing up to 480 hours of paid apprenticeship work
- Be eligible to receive Youth Work in Trades \$1000 from SkilledTradesBC and Ministry of Education (if criteria are met)

Employer Responsibilities

- Have a certified (Red Seal, SkilledTradesBC Certificate of Qualification or sign-off authority with SkilledTradesBC) supervising tradesperson oversee the apprenticeship
- Maintain active WorkSafe BC coverage for employees
- Understand the youth apprenticeship process
- Complete required documents and training plan
- Hire, pay and provide meaningful work for the apprentice
- Submit Work-Based Training Hours to SkilledTradesBC
